

CT Adult Probation 24 Month Rearrest Rate 2007-2011




The Rearrest Rate for probationers 24-months following the start of probation has dropped five percentage points since 2007. For each one percentage point drop in the rearrest rate, 280 fewer probationers are rearrested.

CT Alternative in the Community (AIC) 12 Month Rearrest Rate for Program Completers 2007-2011




The Rearrest Rate for offenders completing the Alternative in the Community (AIC) program has dropped by 10 percentage points since 2007. A 2004 PRI report found that 44 percent of AIC participants were arrested within 12 months.

CT Family Violence 12 Month DV Rearrest Rate, Pretrial Supervision Completers 2009-2011



The Rearrest Rate for DV offenders who complete pre-trial supervision decreased by one percentage point in 2011. This metric measures only rearrests for domestic or family violence incidents.

CT Juvenile Probation 12 Month Rearrest Rate 2007-2011



The Rearrest Rate for juvenile probationers 12-months following the start of probation has dropped over five percentage points since 2007.
