- Preparing for the next Biennium Budget Process and General Assembly session
- The goal to produce objective, benchmark data and information about aspects of the criminal justice system
- Through the Research WG, CJPAC has a unique opportunity to contribute to the discourse
- To make data and analysis available to policy makers in advance
- Two possible topics
  - Disaggregating the blended costs of incarceration
  - Approaching a definition for non-violent offenders



- Disaggregating the blended costs of incarceration
  - What does it cost to house different categories of offenders?
  - Aggregating daily incarceration costs for all offenders obscures the path for solutions
  - Offenders with:
    - significant medical/mental health issues
    - older offenders, hospice care
    - handicapped, HIV/AIDS
  - How many at \$45/day versus \$250/day



- Approaching a pragmatic definition for nonviolent offenders
  - RISK vs. COST
  - What statutes should be included?
  - Should violent crime history degrade with time? Current sentence or sentence history?
  - The problem with the controlling offense.
  - Accuracy and completeness
    - Plea negotiations convictions or arrest
  - Data validated scenarios of the violent prison population
