


### Who are we in JB-CSSD Pretrial Services?

- Indicial Branch Court Support Services Division Staff who collect and provide crucial information to Criminal Court Judges to assist with bail decision-making to ensure court appearances and promote public safety.
- JB-CSSD Pretrial Services is <u>not</u> affiliated with commercial bail bondspeople or the commercial bail bonds industry.
  - Bondspeople accept the responsibility as "surety" for the obligations of another person, especially for bail purposes, and assist those in posting bond to release them from incarcerated status.





The nature and circumstances of the offense insofar as they are relevant to the risk of nonappearance

Record of previous convictions

Past record of appearance in court after being admitted to bail

Family ties

**Employment record** 

Financial resources

Character and mental condition

Community ties

### Risk Assessment Tool Validation


2003 JB-CSSD contracted with Central CT State University (CCSU) – Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice

- Review and validation of existing point scale used through the 1980's and 1990's
- Identify predictive relationship between the weighted release criteria and a client's appearance in court as well as risk to reoffend


### 2013 CCSU Revalidated Tool

- Over 24,000 non-court Bail Interviews and over 11,000 court Bail Interviews were examined
- Weights were reassigned


May 2023 Second Revalidation Began



### Custodial Arrests by Calendar Year Excludes Misdemeanor Summons








## Pretrial Supervision Conditions of Release

## Alternative in the Community (AIC)

- Gender Specific and Co-Educational Life Enhancement Groups.
  - ► Cognitive Skills
  - ► Trauma Support Groups
  - ► Alcohol Use Assistance Groups
  - ► Employment Services and Job Development Groups
- Case Management based on a client's assessed risk and need score.
- Basic Need identification and assistance.
- Supervised Random Breathalyzer and Urinalysis Testing.

## Jail Re-Interview (JRI)

JRI was established in 1997 to assist DOC with prison overcrowding.

JB-CSSD Pretrial Services staff assigned to JRI go to DOC facilities and screen pretrial clients held on bond.

Two tracks: Bond Screens and Referrals

Assist clients in the bond process


JB-CSSD Pretrial Services staff develop community supervision plans and make recommendations to the Court.

## Treatment Pathway Program (TPP)



Innovative court-based pretrial diversionary initiative that provides court-based assessment and referral services.

Court-based clinicians work with JB-CSSD Pretrial Services to identify and serve clients with substance use disorders who are in custody.

Clients are assessed in lockup prior to their arraignment to be safely released, and are immediately connected with clinical and recovery support services in the community.

Care is managed under the collaborative community supervision of JB-CSSD Pretrial and Probation Services and the clinical provider.





### **Clients**

Screened: 2576

Admitted: 1420

#### **Treatment**

64% Admitted one day

78% Completed and did not receive a sentence of incarceration

### Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)


70% Success rate for clients engaged

45% Success rate for clients not engaged


#### **Risk Factors**
