Correctional Populations Indicators Monthly Report

Monthly Correctional Population Indicators Reports are available on the CJPPD website at www.ct.gov/opm/CriminalJustice/Research. In order to provide the most accurate and up to date information these reports are generally posted around the mid-point of each month.

Violent Crime Information

According to the Connecticut Department of Public Safety, Division of State Police, Crime Analysis Unit, the definition of "**Violent Crime** — Any one or the sum total of the following offenses: 1) murder, 2) forcible rape, 3) robbery, and 4) aggravated assault.¹"

Data Note: "Crime in Connecticut" publications are not timely because DPS does not have New Haven data for 2005 or 2006. Without their contribution a large amount of data is missing for violent crime, overall crime, and arrests. To date DPS has not published annual reports without New Haven data. However, you may contact DPS for specific requests.
