 - Discussed Sierra Pretrial Residential; most residents have an SMI; approx. 80% complete. With additional resources Parole could be added as a referral source.
 - David Rentler discussed efforts by parole officers and the Board of Pardons and Paroles to use
 administrative processes to avoid long remands for parolees with SMI since the "waiver" process
 was discontinued. The preliminary hearing for a remand requires a "defense" attorney if the
 parolee is not able to understand the proceedings; an attorney is rarely needed due to SMI, rather
 it is cognitive limitations that are the usual barrier.
 - The CORP program could serve more discharging inmates with SMI with additional resources.
 - Another option is to create special therapeutic units in DOC for inmates with moderate serious mental illness but this would require substantial resources.
