OPM – ASD Needs Assessment, DSS applied for a grant option to complete the statewide ASD needs assessment and OPM is working with DMHAS on a contract for the Supportive Housing Pilot.

BRS – BRS is 100% federally funded and housed in US Dept of Ed, cost of living adjustment was removed and that is 1.5% of their funding, Community Rehabilitation Program CRP's are in high demand, several areas in the state that are not accepting any referrals, or there is a waitlist, this is a lack of availability that BRS has never seen, they are looking for additional options. BRS has been dealing with the economy impact, staff vacancies and turnover of 10% and they are still recovering from 2022 silver wave retirement. Kathy said to let her know if you are hearing of any access issues so she can address.

Please do not use Puzzle Pieces as symbols to represent Autism or Autistic Experience. The Puzzle piece as a symbol has a long history of use by non-autistic led organizations and groups. It also A majority of the autistic community has rejected the puzzle piece due to its history being used by organizations run by neurotypical or non-autistic people that claim to speak for autistic people or that are the experts on Autistic experience.

Dr Schlegel asked about interest in seeing a presentation on supportive housing by Our Stomping ground, the group is interested and we can arrange for a presentation at the next council meeting or during a subcommittee meeting.

7. Legislative Update

Tara Viens

HB 7049: the section on BCBCA regulations and task force was moved to 7109, the task force was assigned to MAPOC, this bill has been moved out of committee

HB 7109: was moved out of HS Committee and includes the language for insurance coverage up to 26 years old. HB 7108: was moved out of committee and includes data collection on profound autism within DDS, it also recommends that the first 2 recommendations of the LON/IQ study be implemented along with some additional tasks specific to my position and DDS.

HB 7076: ASDAC is submitting a letter to oppose the change in special education law ending at age 22

SB 1413: was JF'd out of committee, this will focus on inclusive programs at the CT state universities for people with IDD and ASD

SB1415: moved out of committee, this will increase funding for direct support staff

SB1358: JFS out of committee, increase non-profit funding
