

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#### Centralized

# **Leadership**: Lead agency, department and/or appointed group

#### Benefits

- Easier to coordinate
- Eliminates duplication
- Staff specialization
- Streamlines processes
- Clearer accountability

#### Challenges


- Promoting innovation
- Overcoming hierarchy
- Maintaining flexibility

### Comprehensive

- Covers all needs and priorities
  - Populations served
  - Housing types
  - Housing services
- Coordinates all programs and resources
  - Federal & State
  - Bonds, revenues, grants, subsidies, incentives

#### Coordinated

- All agencies, departments, divisions, offices with housing as a direct mission or indirect concern for their target populations or goals
- Organized around shared comprehensive vision and priorities
- Commits specific **resources** to achieve priorities



# Comparing State Structures: Lead Agency = HFA

- **Example**: Illinois Housing Development Authority
- No Department of Housing
- **Major partners**: Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity; Department of Public Health
- Minor partners: Veterans Affairs, Corrections, etc.

# Comparing State Structures: Lead Agency = Department

- **Example**: Maryland Department of Housing & Community Development
- HFA subsumed as Division within Department
- Major partners: None
- Minor partners: Department of Health & Human Services

# Comparing State Structures: Lead Agency = Shared

- **Example**: New Jersey Department of Community Affairs; Housing & Mortgage Finance Agency
  - DCA manages planning, federal and state subsidies and grants
  - HMFA manages bond financing & tax credits
- Major partners: None
- Minor partners: Council on Affordable Housing

# Comparing State Structures: Lead Agency = Umbrella

- Example: New York Homes & Community Renewal
- Agencies/Divisions under Umbrella include:
  - Multifamily-HFA & Single-family HFA
  - Division of Housing & Community Renewal
  - 4 other agencies/corporations
- Major partners: None
- Minor partners: Office of Temporary & Disability Assistance

## Illinois' Housing Task Force

Illinois' Housing Task Force develops and implements Annual Comprehensive Housing Plan

- Interagency group convened by Lead Agency (HFA), including major & minor partners, and forprofit and nonprofit partners
- Enabling legislation identified 6 Priority
  Populations
- Task Force adopts new policy Focus Areas every year
- Working Groups on emerging issues as needed

## **Comprehensive Housing Plan**

- Strategies, activities, and partners for each Focus
  Area
- Production & resource targets by Priority
  Population
- Resource commitments across multiple agencies
  & programs
- **Technical plan** for implementation: interagency collaboration, responsibilities & resources
- Requires interim progress report (Sept) and final report (Jan) on measured achievements

### Summary

Clear, centralized leadership with authority & accountability

**Comprehensive** planning around common vision, priorities & populations

**Coordination** with internal and external partners that commits specific resources

Maximize **consumer** experience through transparent, accountable, predictable processes and programs that respect **partners** and steward **public** resources
