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Beginning Tuesday, May 6, 2025, the [Fiscal Health Monitoring System](#) (FHMS) will be available for municipalities to complete their annual required filings as indicated below.

[Municipal Budget Database System](#): The MBDS is based upon the FY 2022 to FY 2025 adopted budgets that have been filed by municipalities to date in FHMS. Once municipalities have submitted their FY 2025-26 adopted budget in FHMS, the budget files will be transferred to the MBDS and made available. OPM's MBDS provides a central platform and mechanism by which municipal officials and taxpayers can access and download any of the adopted budgets of the 169 municipalities.
