

Red = 33 - multistate settlements, announced in September 2022


Gold = 7 - multistate settlements, announced in April 2023

Gray = States yet to settle




Connecticut led 34 states and territories in brokering a \$438.5 Million multistate settlement with Juul Labs. From this settlement, Connecticut is due to receive approximately \$16 million to be used for cessation, prevention & mitigation

Commissioner to disburse funding to the regional behavioral health action organizations for funding to support the "abatement, mitigation, cessation, reduction or prevention of the use of nicotine or nicotine-synthetic products by residents under 21 years of age.

Connecticut has received \$1.5 million dollars and will provide \$300,000 to each of the 5 regional behavioral health action organizations. **Status:** Developing contracts.
