Pursuant to Sections 3-37(b) and 3-21(f)(2)(A) of the General Statutes, please find attached the Report for March 2021, which provides information regarding the State's cash position and bonding activity.

Cash balances for March continued to be strong, with total available cash near all-time highs at \$6.3 billion, including the common cash pool of \$5.6 billion as of May 1, 2021. Given the economic uncertainty associated with the current pandemic and the potential impact on State cash receipts and disbursements, we continue to diligently monitor, assess, and revise our Cash projections for Fiscal Year 2021. No temporary transfers from bond proceeds investment accounts have been made since December 2017.
