Pursuant to Sections 3-37(b) and 3-21(f)(2)(A) of the general statutes, please find attached the report for March 2019, which provides information regarding the State's cash position and bonding activity

With April's robust tax receipts, our very strong cash balances continued to grow. As of April 27, 2019, total available cash equaled \$6.0 billion and the common cash pool totaled \$4.4 billion. No temporary transfers from bond proceeds investment accounts have been made since December 2017.
