Pursuant to Sections 3-37(b) and 3-21(f)(2)(A) of the general statutes, please find attached the report for April 2019, which provides information regarding the State's cash position and bonding activity

The State's cash balances remain at very strong levels reflecting better-than expected tax receipts, recent bond sales, and forthcoming Budget Reserve Fund deposits. As of June 1, 2019, total available cash equaled \$5.1 billion and the common cash pool totaled \$3.6 billion. No temporary transfers from bond proceeds investment accounts have been made since December 2017.

As always, my office will keep you up to date on issues concerning cash flow and bonding programs. In the meantime, should you have any questions, please feel free to call.
