Economic Release at glance: CPI EX-Food and Energy YOY

Consumer prices (CPI) are a measure of prices paid by consumers for a market basket of consumer goods and services. The year (or monthly) growth rates represent the inflation rate.



The Fund Management monitors and evaluates the portfolio to ensure compliance with its Investment Policy and adherence to rating agency guidelines. Below table summarizes some of the key metrics.
