COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, is offering a five-day (5) training seminar titled "Advanced Interview & Interrogation Techniques." The training session is scheduled for April 10-14, 2023, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT. The course will be presented by BOWMAC Educational Services/RSI, Inc.

The program is designed to refresh investigators in the basic skills of interviewing and provide a review of basic strategy and structure of interview and interrogation with a focus on what motivates the person being interviewed and how to capitalize on it. The program will provide students with proven strategies to enhance rapport with suspects, victims, and witnesses. The course includes "hands-on" practice through a series of lectures, video exercises and role playing.
