COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division is offering a one (1) day training program on "**Search and Seizure for the Active Officer.**" This training session is scheduled for **Tuesday, January 10, 2023**, from **8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.** at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT. The seminar will be presented by Eric Daigle of the Daigle Law Group.

This seminar focuses on training personnel to become familiar with the concepts of Arrest Procedures and Constitutional Protections, as well as the 4th Amendment. Personnel will become familiar with the concepts below as identified as they apply to Legal Standards and Police Best Practices.

Areas to be covered in Arrest Procedures and Constitutional Protections:

- The 4th, 5th, 6th and 8th Amendments
- Law Enforcement Authority
- Search, Seizure and Expectation of Privacy
- Investigatory Detention (Terry Stop)
- Exclusionary Rule
- Search Warrant Procedure
- Warrantless Arrests
- Felony Warrant Execution

Areas to be covered in the 4th Amendment Warrantless Searches:

- Automobiles
- Community Caretaking Function
- Consent
- Exigent Circumstances
- Incident to Lawful Custodial Arrest
- Inventory Search

- Plain View
- Protective Sweeps
- Abandoned Property
- Technological Advancements
