COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, is offering a three-day (3) training seminar titled "Senior Firearms Instructor Training." The training session is scheduled for June 22, 2022 to June 24, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the Connecticut Police Academy Range, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT. The course will be presented by Lt. Stephen Estes (ret.) and a cadre of firearms instructors.

This program is designed to provide advanced training and tactical techniques and skills to firearms instructors who have had several years of instructional experience. In addition to skill development, the program will provide an update on legal decisions that affect the use of force by law enforcement personnel.

This program will focus on fine-tuning the teaching and shooting skills of the attendees while providing a significant body of current information critical to today's firearms instructors and trainers. The majority of the time will be spent on the range and will be balanced by classroom presentations. The focus of the course will be on service handguns and patrol carbines for officers rather than for tactical teams.

Requirements:

- Five years minimum as a POSTC Certified Firearms Instructor (Area 301).
- Appropriate personal safety equipment, training tourniquet, knee pads, and range attire.
- Duty pistol and belt with at least 4 magazines, and 750 rounds of ammo.
- Patrol rifle with 3 magazines, quality sling, and 200 rounds of ammo.
- .22 LR quality, target pistol or revolver, and 300 rounds of ammo.
 - Suitable pistols: Ruger Mark 3, Mark 4, Browning Buckmark, Smith and Wesson Victory, Model 41, High Standard, Colt Woodsman etc.
 - Suitable revolvers: Smith and Wesson Model 17, 617, K-22, Colt Trooper, Ruger GP, etc.

- .38 special, duty type, DA revolver, with holster, 200 rounds of ammo, speed loaders, speed strips, etc. No snubbies.
- AK-47 type rifle or variant, sling, at least 3 magazines, 400 rounds of ammo.
 - o Suitable models: Ak-47, AK-74, Galil, Valmet 76, MAK-90, and many others.
- Off-duty carry gun, holster, magazines, concealment garment, and 150 rounds of ammobring whatever else you carry for off-duty/EDC.

The program will be presented by Lt. Stephen Estes (ret.) and a cadre of firearms instructors. Lt. Estes was a member of the West Hartford Police Department for over twenty-six years. Lt. Estes served in many capacities, including: Street Crimes Unit, SWAT Operator, SWAT Training Sergeant, Firearms Instructor, SWAT Tactics Instructor, Tactical Chemical Weapons Instructor, Distraction Device Instructor, and TASER Instructor.

The class is limited to fourteen (14) attendees. Applicants must be presently certified as a POSTC Firearms Instructor, in Area 301, with five years of experience as a Firearms Instructor. This training does not satisfy the mandatory firearms training obligation for police officer recertification.
