COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, in cooperation with the Connecticut Coalition Against Domestic Violence (CCADV) and the Family Services Office of the Judicial Branch, is offering a 2-hour training seminar titled "Protections Against and Response to Domestic Violence (GPS Monitoring)." This training will take place at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT. Instruction will be provided by trainers from the Family Services Office of the Judicial Branch. This 2-hours course is scheduled for the following six dates/times.

The training will discuss the Alert Notification/GPS electronic monitoring program, in which Domestic Violence offenders who meet certain criteria are monitored via GPS technology until their criminal case is adjudicated. Offenders who participate in the program are fitted with a GPS-equipped ankle bracelet and shown on a map area that they are required to avoid. These areas are pre-determined by the Court and are based upon information provided by the protected person.

The class is limited to fifty (50) attendees.
