## **COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, is offering a three-day (3) training seminar titled "Leadership." This course is scheduled for Tuesday, May 7, 2024, through Thursday, May 9, 2024, from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. at the Connecticut Police Academy, located at 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT.

This course three-day course is for aspiring and new supervisors. Any officers contemplating leadership or new to a leadership role will benefit from an in-depth look at five basic areas: communication, strategic thinking, empowerment, adaptability, and self-awareness. Through the course participant's will, define their own leadership styles and tendencies focusing on magnifying strengths and strengthening weaknesses, Understand how to integrate emotional intelligence into leadership best practices, Explore the role in coaching and mentoring, and Learn how to effectively seek mentors for your own professional development.

## **Instructional Objectives**

- 1. Understand the critical principles of effective leadership
- 2. Increase self-awareness to recognize blind spots
- 3. Model effective interpersonal communication
- 4. Develop skills and strategies to help leaders build a team
- 5. Develop and influence team members to reach peak performance.
- 6. Learn concepts of empowerment and motivation.
- 7. Identify the evolving response stages to a conflict.

- 8. Identify use of communication techniques such as para-verbal and non-verbal in when diffusing employee conflicts.
- 9. Apply effective coaching techniques
- 10. Learn to define and align performance goals.
- 11. Explore and master the processes of delegating and driving motivation.
- 12. Explore the concepts of self-management, self-awareness, social awareness and relationship management
