COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division is providing a one (1) day "Train-the-Trainer" sessions on the POSTC Use-of-Force Training Program. This training is not meant for instructors who previously took the initial Use of Force Train-the-Trainer 4-hour program through POST. The training will take place Wednesday, June 5, 2024, from 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, 06450.

This course is required for instructors teaching all subcategories within the following subject areas; 209, 301, 302, and 306, as well as 203, 309, and 312.

The course breaks down the <u>Model Policy</u> in its entirety covering all components of the Policy and all the related legal, moral, and ethical requirements/expectations as follows:

- Current Climate & Recent History
- The Legal Standard: Objective Reasonableness
- Moral & Ethical Obligations Regarding the Use of Force
 - o Duty to Intervene
 - o Duty to Render Aid
 - Duty to Report
 - Prohibition Against Retaliation
- Moral Courage
- "Words Matter"
- Illegal Use of Force & Legal Ramifications

- Key Terms & Definitions Related to the Use of Force
- De-escalation & Mitigation
 - Last Resort
 - Officer Created Jeopardy
- Physical, Less Lethal & Deadly Use of Force
- Necessary vs. Permissible: "I can, but do I have to?"
- Prohibited Uses of Force (Restrictions)
- Use of Firearms
