COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division is providing a one (1) day "**Hate and Bias Crime Model Policy "Train the Trainer" (T-t-T)**" session on the statewide POST-C Investigation and Reporting of Hate Crimes Statewide Policy. The training will take place on **Monday, December 16, 2024, from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M.** at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, 06450. This course is mandatory for all current instructors with the 524 Instructor endorsement and open to all other law enforcement personnel.
