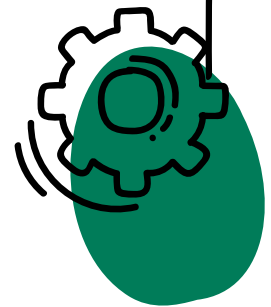
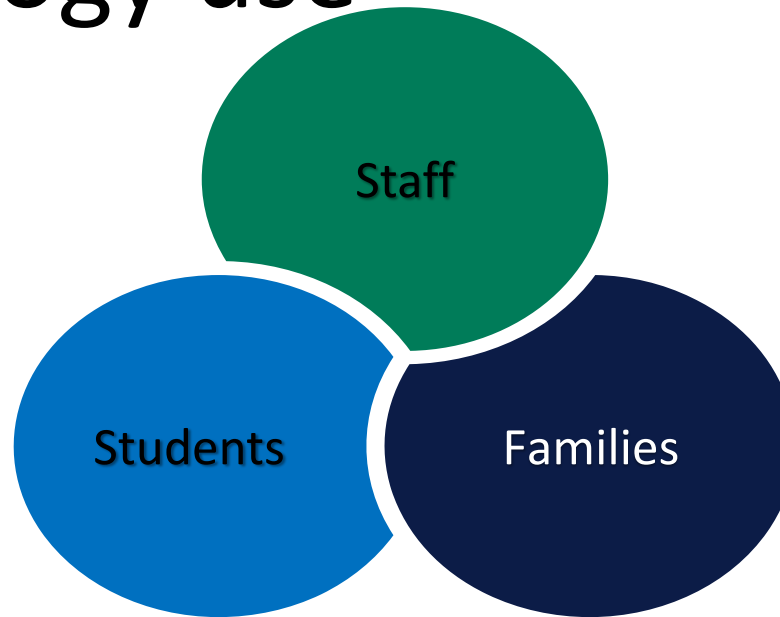

Late Spring/Summer 2020

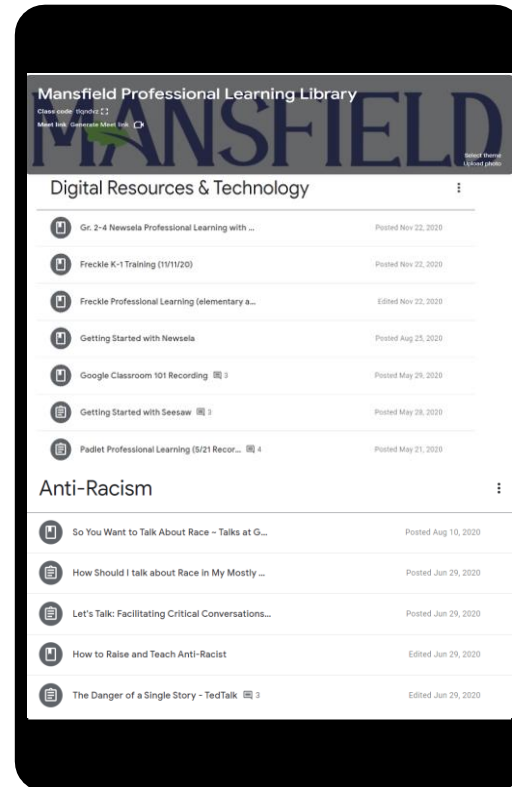
- Curated a Professional Learning Library of both internal and external resources.

- Family Resource Fair

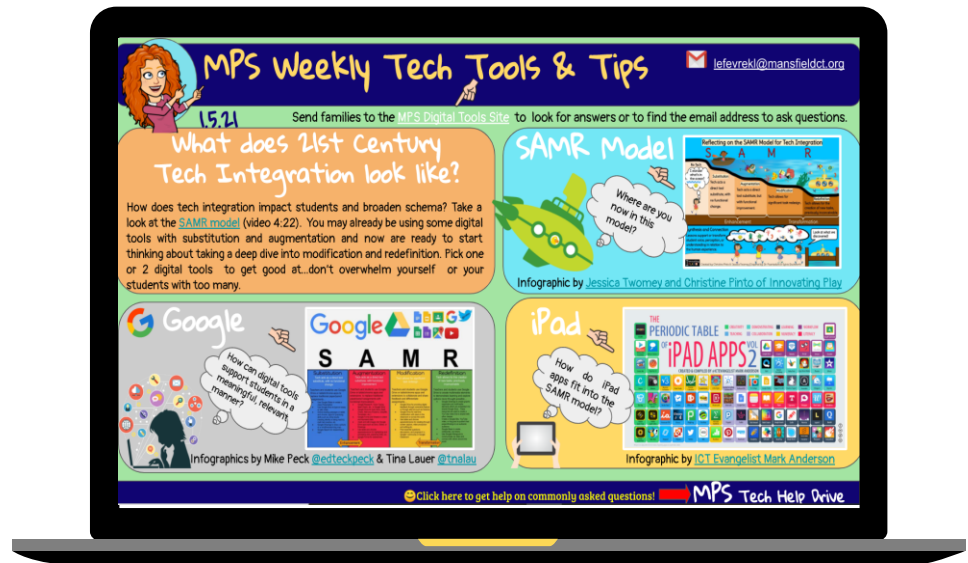
Mansfield Professional Learning Library

- X Stay student focused.

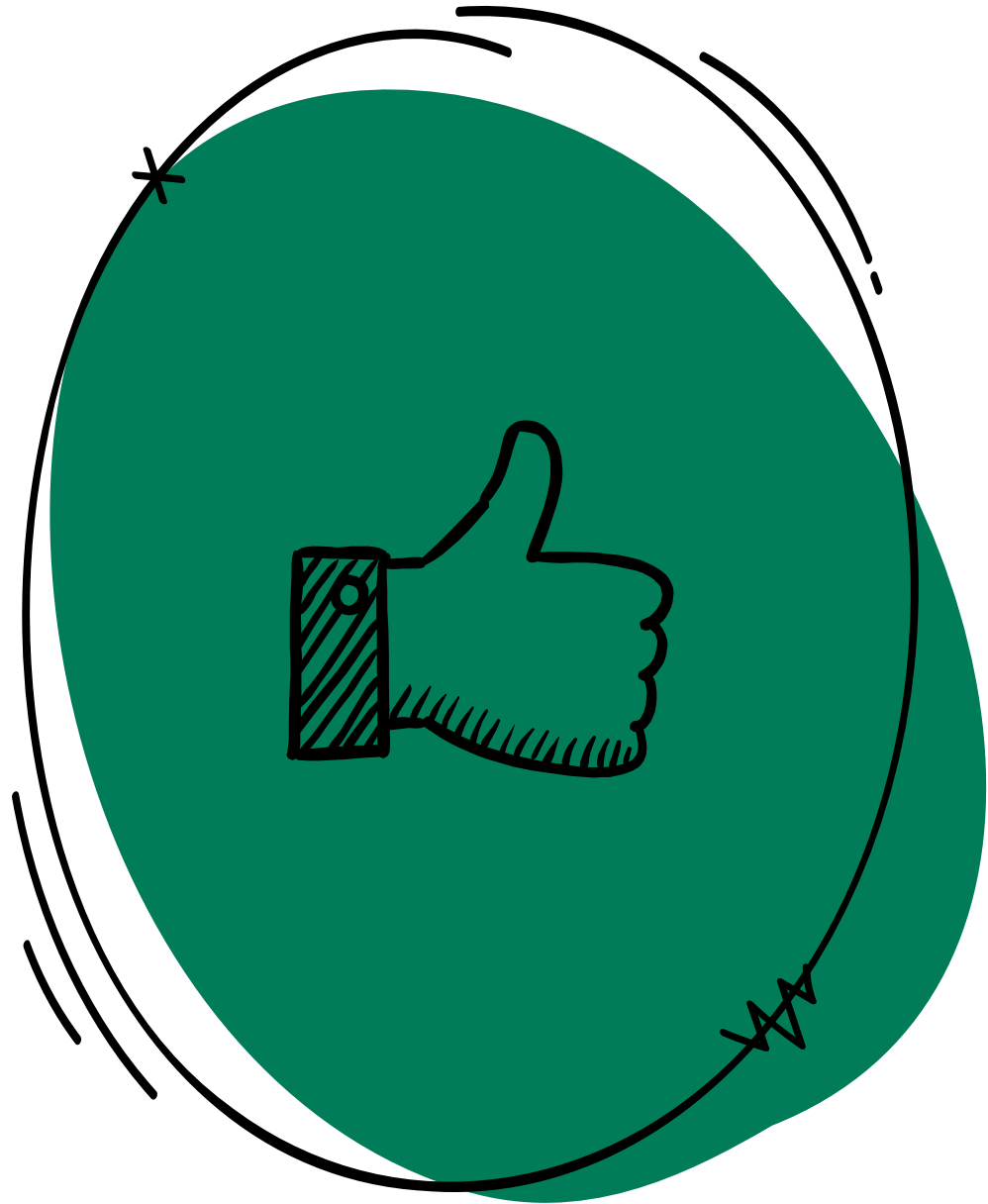

- Updated infrastructure to accommodate traffic



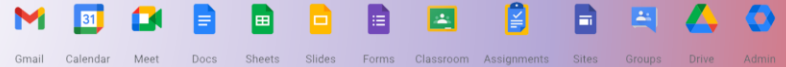

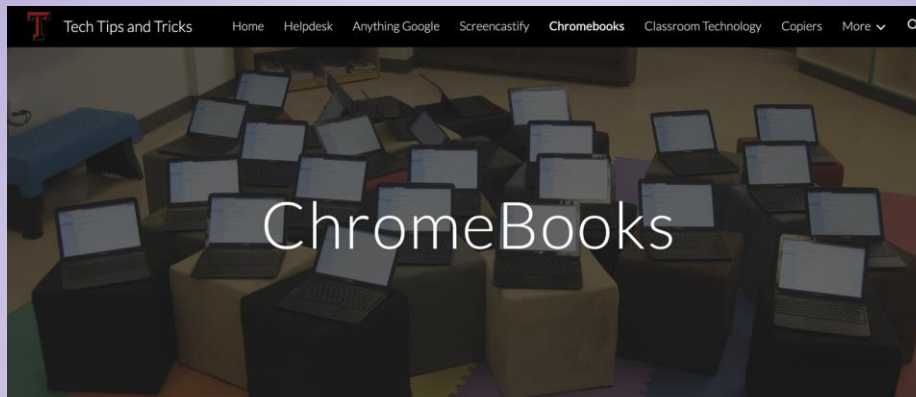

Lessons Learned

- It's OK to not be perfect
- Video is not for everyone and does not replace Face to Face, One on One help
- The scope of this project and the move to 1:1 was not an easy task
- When the shutdown occurred, staff did not have access to their digital materials that were stored on the network
- Availability of devices
- Shipping delays
- Order mixups
- Timing of demands and funding availability
- Currently a single lens point of view



The road ahead

- Moving to expand the site to include tips and lessons from teachers and other staff to cover a much greater variety of topics applicable to all of K-12
- Not all videos apply to the entire audience
- Create filters by topic and grade level
- Keep looking for new ways to make professional development entertaining and fun
- Expand live PD offerings based on feedback
- Create timeline to update outdated materials with new videos
- Expand to student created materials to support other students and parents
- Offer all student and parent materials on both English and Spanish
- Utilize public access television to broadcast lessons to families' homes
