Additional Feedback and Next Steps:

The strategies and progress metrics for Priorities #1-4 in Section #6 would benefit from additional detail, for example:

- Further refine the outcome metric for Priority #1 to include how the district will measure the impact of trained instructional coaches on student learning and/or instructional quality.
- In Section 6, Priority #1, add strategies and progress metrics to identify what the coaching model will look like in practice and how the district will measure its impact on teaching and learning.
- Priorities # 2-4 were expanded in the budget summary to add resources at Briggs and Ponus, but these additional activities are not included in Section #6. The additional strategies need to be identified in Section #6.
- Consider relabeling Priority #2 to capture the general focus on reading now that the priority includes Read 180 implementation at Briggs and Ponus. All students reading at goal by 3rd grade can been an outcome measure for this priority.
- Consider relabeling Priority #3 to capture the more general focus on implementing rigorous math instruction aligned to CCSS. The math interventions for Briggs and Ponus should be identified as strategies.
- How will Norwalk monitor the implementation of new curricula identified in Priority #2 and #3?
- Extended learning time is referenced in the description of the district's school turnaround strategy (pp. 39-40) but is not included in Section #6. Please add this as a strategy.
- Provide more information on educator evaluation and support. Please expand upon the responses on page #33 to address the following: (1) How is the district providing ongoing evaluation and calibration training to ensure evaluator proficiency? (2) How will the district and schools use teacher evaluation data to inform and shape professional learning opportunities?
