1.1 Professional Learning for Instructional Leaders - The Chief of Schools, Chief Academic Officer, and (content) Directors will provide targeted, job-embedded professional learning for all instructional leaders in the areas of district planning, capacity building, performance management, and district established non-negotiables as part of the district's Strategic Plan. The professional learning topics at every session work toward the following, overarching goals: 1) Build team, celebrate, and identify practices that keep core values alive in schools, 2) Deepen understanding of content for major actions, 3) Examine the budget process, 4) Build curriculum, instruction, and assessment literacy across all content areas. Each session zooms in on a timely and proactive focus working toward these long term goals for school and district leadership. Example of PD sessions: Budget - School leaders will examine, discuss and collaborate on determining resource allocations and forecasting for the budget; Building Assessment Literacy - Content Directors will offer stations on the content assessments for school leaders to practice taking snapshots of the assessments. Rationale: Professional learning with school leaders is vital to the growth and alignment of the entire district. As we refine our foci to the major actions that align with our Strategic Operating Plan, the school leadership plays a central role in connecting the district and each other and ensuring that the through-line between staff and students and central office support and leadership is strong. This professional development works to minimize the challenges of a large, urban district with many moving parts by keeping a stringent focus on alignment and communication of the same message through the partnership and support provided during these session together.

Rationale: The creation and implementation of this coaching and supervision model will support the development of leaders' instructional lens, capacity to provide timely and specific feedback, and use of a continuous improvement cycle to improve teaching and learning. In collaboration with Achievement Network (ANet), the Office of School Leadership has established clear goals and professional learning sessions for Principals and their Instructional Leadership Teams aligned to increasing capacity in instructional leadership. These sessions will be focused on climate, equitable practices, mathematics, and literacy directly related to data-driven decision making and the goals within each team's school improvement plan. Administrator Institutes for Principals will be held twelve times throughout the year. In addition, Assistant Principals and Deans will also participate in nine institutes throughout the year. Professional learning for staff will be both school-based (one full day/five half days) and district-based (eight half days).

1.3 Instructional Leadership Practice Sessions for Continuous Improvement - The Chief of Schools, Chief Academic Officer and Executive Directors of School Leadership will provide school-based leaders with opportunities to engage in cycles of continuous improvement through the use of monthly Instructional Leadership Practice sessions (ILPs). Rationale: The implementation of ILPs will support our district goal to increase the number of instructional leaders that obtain a highly effective evaluation rating, as well as increasing the retention of highly effective leaders. During ILPs, school leaders will visit model classrooms to assess standards-based instruction and the quality of instruction. School leaders will develop common understanding of the Hartford Public Schools Administrators Evaluation Instrument (ADEVAL) and other instructional practices to develop coherence in their assessment of practice. They will use real-time data to practice delivery of teacher feedback. School leaders will engage in professional learning opportunities through collaboration with the central office teams to develop school-based action plans, complete regular learning walks, and attend academic content learning sessions. 2.1 CORE DISTRICT PRIORITY #1 - Increased Support, Coaching and Training for Math Instruction - In partnership with Math Solutions, the Director of Mathematics and Assistant Director of Mathematics will develop the capacity of e-LEAD Math Coaches to implement the District Coaching Framework. e-LEAD Math Coaches will provide pedagogical support - establish math goals to focus learning, implement tasks that promote reasoning and problem solving, use and connect math representations, and support productive struggle in learning math and content support on Common Core standards. Support for Eureka Math in grades K-7, Carnegie Learning in Grade 8 and Algebra I, and the State Model Curriculum in Algebra II and Geometry & Data will be provided. Carnegie Learning will train grade 8 teachers and offer in-class professional learning. Elementary teachers will implement Do The Math or ST Math. Through the implementation of Latinos in Action, an evidence-based program which utilizes a bicultural and bilingual college and career readiness curriculum, students will leverage personal and cultural assets, participate in academic tutoring, engage in service learning, and develop leadership skills. Rationale: Increasing the high school graduation rate is a priority for Hartford Public Schools. These partnerships, focused on college and career readiness, will have a positive impact on student skills attainment and ultimately on the graduation rate. Research findings by Bridgeland (2010) and Yeboah 2010) state that dropping out of school is not only a personal issue for the student but is also a social and economic issue. The relationship between poverty and dropping out of school has been long established and the impact is long lasting.

Principals and Instructional Leadership Teams will engage in learning activities using walkthrough tools at minimum of five times per year to gauge schools implementation of the non-negotiables. Personnel, including the Assistant Director of Literacy, Literacy Coaches, and Curriculum Specialists will work to monitor and provide the previously mentioned supports. eLEAD coaches will play an integral role in the execution of professional learning through coaching cycles, collaborative structures, data teams, and school-based learning walks. Rationale: This strategy is a continuation of the job-embedded supports used by the district in the past. Changes this year include the focus on Guided Reading and Close Reading, as well as the adapted coaching structure through eLEAD. The eLEAD model is an investment in the training and capacity-building of school leaders and is intended to streamline the supports coaches provide to schools, ensuring coaching is the main priority, with ongoing job-embedded professional learning on the district strategic actions and goals to increase ELA proficiency and graduation rates. We will collaborate with outside partners, the University of Connecticut (Dr.Sarah Woulfin) and the CSDE (ReadConn, CT Literacy Model), for coaches to build leadership and literacy knowledge, and in turn, building the capacity of principals and Instructional Leadership Teams.

3.1 CORE DISTRICT PRIORITY #3 - Continuous Improvement for Attendance Teams - Efforts to maximize operational effectiveness and ensure accountability via re-launch of district/school-based teams to establish and implement procedures and protocols to ensure tracking and analysis of data, support for case management of CA/truant students, and timely referrals to outside agencies. Hire staff to support schools, monitor adherence to procedures, offer best practices and assist with data. Attendance Manual will be revised. Supports from partners, i.e. Attendance Works. District Attendance Remediation Team (DART) and Office of Outreach district-wide attendance campaign. Rationale: Hartford Public Schools has shifted from a model reliant on reaction and response to one of planning, preparedness, and positive, proactive environmental and human supports for behavior management. HPS's holistic individualized student support system (Whole Student) will maintain progress on the following action steps: professional learning opportunities on Trauma Informed Care and Restorative Approaches and Practices; establishing practices to ensure the implementation of proactive strategies for behavior management; continuous analysis of data to identify root causes of behavior, provide students with multiple tiers of graduated behavioral supports and interventions, and enact progressive and equitable disciplinary practices.

Program Design

1. Description of the type of academic supports and enrichment offered.

Hartford Public Schools envisions a system of extended day programs that are coordinated and aligned with the instructional programs offered during students' regular school day. Community-based organizations that have been funded by the Extended School Hours grant provided a variety of academic supports and enrichment, such as Homework Help (YMCA), Career Readiness (Urban League of Greater Hartford) and STEM activities (Girls for Technology).

2. Description of the type of health and recreational activities offered.

Community-based organizations that have been funded by the Extended School Hours grant provided a variety of health and recreational activities, such as: Equine Therapy (Ebony Horsewomen), Basketball Tournaments (The Village for Families and Children) and healthy eating and cooking (The Village for Families and Children).

3. Description of the criteria for student participation (e.g., days, hours of operation).

Criteria for student participation varies by community-based organization and is dependent on the type of programming being offered. All resident students of the district are eligible. Programming is offered for students in grades K-12. Some programs operate 5 days per week for 3 hours per day, while other specialized programs operate 2 days per week for 2 hours per day.

4. Description of how the district will ensure the program supports the regular school curriculum.

All extended day programs are expected to be developed and operated by community-based organizations in collaboration with school principals and other essential personnel. Community-based organizations must clearly articulate how programming will meet the needs of the school and students to be served by completing the Outcomes Measurement Framework that is part of the district's Extended School Hours grant application.

5. Description of how the program provides for community involvement (40 percent of funding must support community partners).

The Extended School Hours grant is fully implemented in conjunction with community-based organizations. Hartford Public Schools solicits proposals from qualified community-based organizations to provide extended day programming in Hartford's Priority Schools. In 2017-18, the grant was able to fund 10 community-based organizations that partnered with 15 schools.

6. Description of how the program coordinates operations and activities with existing programs and the agencies in the school (if applicable).

Community-based organizations that are funded by the Extended School Hours grant collaborate with school principals to ensure that funded programs and activities are coordinated with existing programs and activities in the schools. Examples of coordination include targeted recruitment of students, sharing of space, and referencing the school activity calendar when scheduling special events.

7. Description of the plan for involving parents in program planning and using parents as advisers and volunteers.

Community-based organizations are expected to encourage and support parental involvement in programming. Many programs create opportunities for parents to volunteer at special events and attend parent groups to discuss programming and provide feedback.

8. Description of the plan for the superintendent and school principal to work collaboratively with the community-based organization(s) for access to the school's facilities and equipment.

Community-based organizations in receipt of an award are required to complete a contract with the Board of Education signed by the Superintendent or the Deputy Superintendent. The contract includes provisions for the use of school facilities and equipment as appropriate.

System for Monitoring Results

Teachers use DIBELS to progress monitor the phonemic awareness of each student throughout the four weeks of summer school. They also use the Quick Phonics Screener weekly or as needed. Attendance is entered in Power School and academic data is entered via Power Teacher. At the start of this academic year, student progress was monitored via the use of DIBELS during the assessment period from 9/28/18- 10/5/18. The F&P benchmark assessment system is also administered three times per year. The district has prioritized the use of guided reading, thus students will be consistently monitored in this area. Instruction is also tailored to meet the needs of students through the use of data and flexible grouping.
