

 - Chronic Absenteeism 31%




THE IMPACT OF TRAUMA AT CROSS

Prevelance of Trauma

- ALIVE Questionnaire given to students in International Academy in 2015-16
- 247 students surveyed
- 70% of students report at least one traumatic life event and psychological symptoms as a result
- ▶ 89% chose to put their name on the survey


THE IMPACT OF TRAUMA AT CROSS

- "An ounce of prevention..."


WHAT DOES A RESPONSIVE PARTNERSHIP LOOK LIKE AT CROSS?

- Whole School Approach
- Working with individual students: Increasing referrals

- Data collection/assessment
