SUBJECT: Approval of Charter School Enrollments

Executive Summary

Introduction

In accordance with Section 10-66bb(c) of the Connecticut General Statutes (C.G.S.), on July 19, 2017, the State Board of Education (SBE) approved the distribution of 9,913 seats in state charter schools for the 2017-18 school year. The number of seats to be distributed was determined based on the funds made available pursuant to Governor Malloy's Executive Order "Resource Allocation Plan" for Fiscal Year 2018, since the state budget had not yet been passed. Upon passage of the budget, Public Act 17-2, of the June Special Session, additional funding was appropriated in the Charter School budget line item. The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) seeks the SBE's approval to distribute 57 additional seats for three charter schools.

Background

CSDE seeks approval for additional seats at Capital Preparatory Harbor, Common Ground, and Elm City College Preparatory charter schools. Based on their October 1, 2017 enrollment filing, each of these schools has enrolled students above the SBE approved enrollment level for 2017-18. Capital Preparatory Harbor School over enrolled by 35 seats, Common Ground by 2 seats and Elm City College Preparatory by 33 seats.

There are state charter school enrollment caps of 300 seats for schools serving Grades K-8 and 250 for all other grade levels. Two of the schools exceed these caps and will need a charter grant enrollment waiver. Applying the statutory per-pupil rate for state charter schools of \$11,000 for 2017-18, these totals are within available appropriations. The enrollments are disaggregated and detailed in Table 1 (attached).

Recommendation

The CSDE recommends that the SBE approve the additional 57 seats to be distributed among these three schools, and approve grant enrollment waivers for Capital Preparatory Harbor and Elm City College Preparatory which are serving students beyond the statutory cap in the 2017-18 school year.
