Executive Summary

Introduction

As stipulated in Section 10-5(a) of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Commissioner of Education has approved the General Educational Development (GED) tests as the approved examination for earning a Connecticut State High School Diploma. The Connecticut State Department of Education annually honors the individual(s) who attained the highest score on the GED tests during the previous calendar year.

History/Background

Connecticut's GED Testing Program provides an opportunity for youth and adults not enrolled in school to obtain their high school diplomas. Since 1971, it is estimated that more than 162,000 Connecticut residents have earned a state high school diploma through successful completion of the GED tests. Currently, the GED tests are offered at 23 test centers across Connecticut.

Recommendation and Justification

I recommend that the State Board of Education recognize Richard Chi and Jason Miller as the GED Scholars for 2015. They earned a total score of 764 out of a possible 800, which were the highest scores attained in Connecticut during 2015.

Mr. Chi's and Mr. Miller's achievement brings honor to them, the State Board of Education and the State of Connecticut. I am pleased to recommend them for recognition as the GED Scholars for 2015.
