SUBJECT: Reappointments to the Connecticut Advisory Council for Teacher Professional Standards

Executive Summary

Introduction

Pursuant to subsection (b) of Section 10-144d of the Connecticut General Statutes, the State Board of Education (SBE) is required to appoint two of the 17 members to the Connecticut Advisory Council for Teacher Professional Standards. One appointee is to represent the faculty or administration of a SBE-approved teacher preparation program and the other is to represent business and industry.

History/Background

The Council was established to (1) advise the SBE, the Governor, and the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to education concerning teacher preparation, teacher recruitment, teacher certification, teacher professional development, teacher assessment and evaluation, and teacher professional discipline; (2) review and comment upon all regulations and other standards concerning the approval of teacher preparation programs and teacher certification; (3) report to the SBE, the Governor, and the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to education annually on its activities and recommendations, if any, concerning the condition of the teaching profession; and (4) develop a code of professional responsibility for teachers not later than September 30, 1993.

On June 21, 1993, the SBE voted to adopt the code of professional responsibility located in the Regulations Concerning State Educator Certificates, Permits, and Authorizations (Section 10-145d-400a).

Recommendation and Justification

In order to restore full membership to the Connecticut Advisory Council for Teacher Professional Standards the following individuals are recommended for reappointment by the Connecticut SBE:

Marianne M. Downie – Ms. Downie is Assistant Vice President and Senior Counsel in the Property & Casualty Coverage Group, Law Department, at The Hartford Insurance Company. She joined The Hartford in 2004 and currently leads a team of lawyers in providing coverage advice and overseeing litigation involving such matters as environmental remediation, construction defect, and other complex claims. James Carl – Dr. Carl is Professor of Education in the Farrington College of Education at Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut. He is keenly interested in preparing top notch teacher-leaders for our public schools, and to that end he teaches courses that stress ethical pedagogy and effective school reform, supervises student teachers in their penultimate semester, and directs graduate students in their written work.

Prior to earning his Ph.D. in Educational Policy Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Dr. Carl taught history and economics at a public high school in New Hampshire. He also taught at a residential treatment center for adolescents. His research interests are

the history and politics of education reform in the United States, Europe, and Asia. Dr. Carl's articles have appeared in *American Journal of Education*, *Comparative Education Review*, *Harvard Educational Review*, *Social Science History*, and *Teachers College Record*. His book, *Freedom of Choice: Vouchers in American Education*, explores privatization movements and the conflicting purposes of their supporters.

Before he was appointed Dean of the Farrington College of Education in 2012, Dr. Carl served on the faculty of education at John Carroll University in University Heights, Ohio, and as chair of the Department of Curriculum and Foundations at Cleveland State University in Cleveland, Ohio. A resident of Bridgeport, Dr. Carl has four grown children.

In addition to his four children and their various interests, Dr. Carl enjoys cycling and soccer.
