V.B. <u>District Improvement Plan: East Hartford</u>

Commissioner McQuillan presented a brief historical overview of the East Hartford District Improvement Plan. Dr. Carolan, Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Accountability, summarized the committee's meeting with the Superintendent and Board Chair and specific recommendations to address in the plan. Discussion followed.

X.A. Redesign of Licensed Practical Nurse Program

Abigail Hughes, Superintendent of the Connecticut Technical High School System, presented the report to the Board. Discussion followed.

V.C. <u>Draft Audit Policy</u>

Mrs. Luke presented the draft Audit Policy and Mission Statement to the Board. Discussion followed.

VI. Report of the Chair – Mr. Taylor reported the following:

- NASBE Legislative Conference Mr. Taylor reported that it is unlikely that any legislative action on the NCLB Act will be taken this year. Mr. Taylor and Mrs. Bobroske met with federal legislators on issues involving the Migrant Education program.
- NASBE has invited Boards of Education to submit the name of one of its members to be nominated by NASBE for the National Technical Advisory Council (NTAC). (Related information contained in your supplemental materials folder.) Nominations from NASBE to the US Department of Education are due April 9.
- CABE/CSDE Dinner Series: (Designed for superintendents and board of education leaders of urban districts, and districts working with the CSDE per Connecticut's accountability legislation.) A reminder that SBE members are invited to participate in the upcoming sessions (April 8th; May 13th; and June 12th). Mr. Taylor will be attending the April 8th session "Life After Cambridge Assessment" at the Four-Points Sheraton in Meriden. The session on the 13th follows the "Data Showcase" at the Crowne Plaza in Cromwell.
- Highville Charter School Renewal Hearing was held last week. Janet Finneran chaired the hearing and stated that approximately 200 people attended the hearing and every speaker was very supportive of the renewal of the charter.

VII. Report of the Commissioner - Commissioner McQuillan reported on the following:

- **NAEP Press Release**: Students in approximately 100 Connecticut high schools will take part in a new 12th grade state-level mathematics and reading pilot program for the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) next year.
- Education Week "Technology Counts 2008" The push to improve science, technology, engineering and mathematics, was recently released. This publication provides state-by-state comparisons of performance, gaps and state "grades".
- Governor's School and College Security Conference, was held on March 27th at Central Connecticut State University (CCSU). The Governor made introductory remarks. The Keynote Speaker was Dr. Jo Ann Freiberg of the State Department of Education. Joining the Commissioner were Commissioners of Public Safety, Higher Education and Emergency Management and Homeland Security.
- **Update on SHEFF** This in an on-going process and we will have more information by the end of the day.
- Windham Public Schools Mr. Taylor and I went to Windham to speak to the Board of Education regarding their district improvement plan. The Department will be sending a team in to work with the Superintendent.
- On March 26th several board members and I had a meeting in the Lt. Governor's office regarding the low enrollment and future of J.M. Wright Technical High School.

Brian Mahoney, Chief Financial Officer, Division of Finance and Internal Operations, provided the Board with the Appropriations Committee Budget Highlights. Discussion followed.
