## CONNECTICUT STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Hartford

Minutes

March 3, 2010, Meeting

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board) met on Wednesday, March 3, 2010. The meeting was held at the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

#### I. Call to Order

#### II. Public Participation

1. Joseph Cirasuolo, CAPSS, spoke to the Board regarding agenda item IX.E., Intent to Adopt Regulations Concerning IDEA. Dr. Cirasuolo urged the Board to consider shifting the burden of proof from the district to parents.

2. Kelly Moyher, CABE, gave testimony to the Board regarding agenda item IX.E., Intent to Adopt Regulations Concerning IDEA. Ms. Moyher asked the Board to address the burden of proof issue in the proposed amendments to the special education regulations. 3. Dr. Vivian Cross, Executive Director of the Foundation for Educational Advancement, Inc. and Health Education Consultant for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, spoke to the Board regarding lead poisoning resulting in a myriad of health problems and the need to recognize the impact of lead poisoning on students' education. She noted that the civil rights of children are being violated due to noncompliance with Part B and C of the IDEA, and asserted the need to develop guidelines to address this.

o the Middletown Board of Education shall provide the State Board of Education no later than June 30, 2010 with a specific plan to redraw the district's attendance zones and shall include projections of the racial composition of the public schools in the district for the subsequent five-year period under the proposed course of action with implementation to begin in the fall of 2010; and

- o the Middletown Board of Education shall submit to the State Board of Education its final plan for approval no later than February 1, 2011, which shall include:
  - its plan for partial choice enrollment at Macdonough School to begin in the fall of 2011; and
  - a specific plan for the intradistrict magnet school at Macdonough School, including but not limited to, admission criteria and enrollment projections for the subsequent five-year period with implementation to begin in the fall of 2012; and

directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

### IX.F. <u>Adoption of Regulations Concerning Administration of Medication</u> <u>by School Personnel and Administration of Medication During Before-and After-School Programs and School Readiness Programs</u>

RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education adopts the amendments to Sections 10-212a-1 through 10-212a-10 of the Regulations of the Connecticut State Agencies, concerning the Administration of Medications by School Personnel and Administration of Medication During Before- and After-school Programs and School Readiness Programs, dated March 3, 2010, and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

is some concern by OPM regarding the Charter School Proposals and the discussion is on-going. Mrs. Hopkins-Staten also stated that there is a need to convene a statewide conference on race relations and bullying.

- Policy Development Committee -- Ms. Finneran reported that at the December 16 Policy Committee Meeting, Deputy Commissioner Coleman was asked to review the Minority Teacher Report. Mr. Coleman distributed his response to the Board (a copy of his remarks can be found in the official file of this meeting.)
- Connecticut Technical High School Committee -- Mrs. Bobroske reported that testimony was given before the Education Committee regarding the Connecticut Technical High School System (CTHSS). Dr. Voss would like to see more presentations regarding CALI, power standards and teacher evaluations.
- Ad Hoc Committee on Accountability: Mr. Voss stated that a meeting is scheduled for March 24 with the Hartford School District.
- Ad Hoc Committee on J.M. Wright Technical High School Commissioner McQuillan stated that the committee meets every two weeks to discuss timelines, review of core programs and the renovation of JM Wright.
