# CONNECTICUT STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Hartford

#### Minutes

June 2, 2010, Meeting

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, June 2, 2010. The meeting was held at the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

#### I. Call to Order

#### II. Public Participation

- 1. Tom Cronin, Representing the RESC Alliance, spoke to the Board on how the Alliance collectively reviewed the proposed regulations and is in support of the new regulations for Special Education Teacher and Intervention Specialist PK-12. Mr. Cronin's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting.
- 2. Karen Beyard, Professor of Educational Leadership at Central Connecticut State University, expressed support for the content requirements of the proposed teacher leader certificate and offered suggestions regarding implementation of the proposed regulation. Ms. Beyard's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting.

- 3. Marilyn Scanlan White, Legislative Chair, Connecticut Reading Association, expressed support for the proposal for certification of Literacy Specialist, and asked that the title include Literacy Coach. She spoke to the Board regarding the need to follow International Reading Association (IRA) standards for Reading Professionals, so that our training universities around the state will continue to receive accreditation through NCATE. - 4. Sandra Mangan, President of the Connecticut Reading Association, spoke in support of one certification of Literacy Specialist and the IRA's standards for administrator candidates. Ms. Mangan's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting.
- 5. Jackie Greene, Vice President, the Connecticut Reading Association, supports minimum of two courses in reading and writing at content level. Mrs. Greene's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting.
- 6. Bob Rath, President and CEO of Our Piece of the Pie, spoke in support of Hartford's proposed corrective action order. Mr. Rath's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting.
- 7. David Calchera, Director of Policy, CAPSS, stated that there is consensus regarding the proposal concerning Special Education and the Literacy Specialist. Mr. Calchera stated that he would support the teacher leader endorsement as an optional endorsement.
- 8. Joshua Starr, Superintendent, Stamford Public Schools, spoke in support of the JM Wright Technical School proposal. He stated that the Stamford region is in need of a strong, vibrant technical high school.
- 9. Bill Troy, Executive Director, Highville Charter School, spoke in support of the renewal of the charter (agenda item VI.B.).
- 10. Alexis Highsmith, Chair, Board of Directors at Highville Charter School, spoke in support of the renewal of the charter and thanked the State Department staff for their help.
- 11. Lloyd Johnson, Executive Director, ISAAC Charter School, spoke in support of the renewal of the charter (agenda item VI.C.). He also thanked Ms. Hopkins-Staten for chairing the public hearing and Robert Kelly, Education Consultant, State Department of Education, for his support.

- 12. Kate Fioravanti, Head Teacher at ISAAC and one of the founding teachers in 1997, explained the success of the school through the music program and how it has carried over to academics.
- 13. Danielle Smith, Member of the Board of Directors of New Beginnings Family Academy Charter School, spoke in support of the renewal of New Beginnings Family Academy charter (agenda item VI.A.).
- 14. Deidre Lindsay, parent of one former student and two current New Beginnings Family Academy students, stated that New Beginnings Family Academy recognizes the importance of family and its role in education, and spoke in support of renewing the charter.
- 15. Thomas Lindsay, 6<sup>th</sup> grade student at New Beginnings Family Academy, stated he receives good instruction and good citizen skills.
- 16. Tai Outlaw, 7<sup>th</sup> grade student at New Beginnings Family Academy, stated that he likes the advanced work (algebra and chemistry). The Academy is preparing students for their futures.
- 17. Paul Whyte, Principal of New Beginnings Family Academy, thanked the board and Robert Kelly, Education Consultant at the State Department of Education, for their support.
- 18. Brian Farrell, Director of Special Services, Redding Public Schools and representative of the Connecticut Council of Administrators of Special Education (CONNCASE), stated that given the current SRBI mandates in the state of Connecticut, it is essential that special education teacher enter the work force well-versed in specialized teaching strategies.
- 19. Mary Loftus Levine, Director of Policy and Professional Practice, Connecticut Education Association (CEA), commented on three of the proposed changes to teacher certification regulations: special education, literacy specialist and teacher leader. - 20. Linette Branham, Educational Issues Specialist, Connecticut Education Association (CEA), submitted to the Board copies of CEA's proposals for certification in the areas of special education and literacy. A copy of these proposals can be found in the official file of this meeting.

John Mattas, Connecticut Association for Private Special Education Facilities, stated that he agrees with cross endorsement for teachers of students with severe disabilities. Mr. Mattas stated that training and mentoring is critical, and recommended that we look at the outcomes of different models (e.g., Boston residency).
