Minutes

July 7, 2010, Meeting

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, July 7, 2010. The meeting was held at the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

I. Call to Order

Laura Anastasio, Attorney, Legal and Governmental Affairs, administered the Oath of Office to Neha Mehta, student member from Suffield and Patrick Campbell, student member from Chester.

II. Public Participation

1. Martin Edgar, Hartford Federation of Substitute Teachers and former substitute teacher at Vinal Technical High School, expressed concerns about not having been called back to substitute teach for over one year. Mr. Edgar's written testimony can be found in the official file of this meeting.

Nancy Hoffman, Professor of Teacher Education at Central Connecticut State University, offered her professional opinion on the proposed changes in certification requirements for teachers of students with special needs. She stated that the Department's proposal that special education become a cross endorsement attached to an existing teaching certificate insures that special educators will have a deep knowledge of the content to be taught as well as the required repertoire of specialized strategies. - 3. Javarria Sandiford, parent of a child at Molloy School in West Haven, expressed concern regarding the closing and rationale for closing Molloy School.

Gwen Samuels, parent and co-founder State of Black CT Alliance, invited the Board to an Age 3 to Kindergarten Curriculum meeting at Central Connecticut State University on July 14th from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Ms. Samuels asked the State Department to intervene regarding the closure of Molloy school in West Haven, which is a high performing school.
- 5. Sandy Mangan, Ct Reading Association (CRA) President, spoke to the Board regarding the proposed certification for Literacy Specialists, Administrators, Teacher Leaders, and Classroom Teachers. Ms. Mangan's written comments can be found in the official file of this meeting

Dr. Martinez, Associate Commissioner, Division of Teaching, Learning & Instructional Leadership; Nancy Pugliese, Bureau Chief, Bureau of Educator Standards and Certification; and Georgette Nemr, Education Consultant, Bureau of Educator Standards and Certification, presented the report to the Board. Discussion ensued.

VII.B. Policy Statement on Admission to a Connecticut Technical High School
