# CONNECTICUT STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Hartford

January 18, 2012, Meeting

**Draft Minutes**

# V. Report of the Chair

Mr. Taylor requested a moment of silence in memory of Tom Murphy, the longtime spokesperson for the Department, who passed away earlier this month. Mr. Murphy will be sorely missed by his family, friends and so many colleagues across the state who had the pleasure of working with him.

Mr. Taylor reported that he, Stephen Wright and Ferdinand Risco will be attending the NASBE Board of Directors meeting later this week.

Mr. Taylor reported on the Governor's Education Workshop, January 5, 2012, at CCSU.

# VI. Report of the Commissioner

Commissioner Stefan Pryor reported the following:

The Department is in the process of preparing its application for a waiver from the requirements of No Child Left Behind (NCLB), which is due February 21, 2012. If the request is successful, the waiver will give the Department the flexibility to design a new system of accountability for schools and districts and to target federal funds to better meet the needs of Connecticut's students.

Commissioner Pryor explained the four requirements of the waiver application and summarized the Department's efforts in each area. The first area of focus -- college and career readiness -- requires that Common Core State Standards (CCSS) be implemented effectively in every classroom across the state. He explained that this work has been underway since the Board adopted the CCSS in 2010. The second requirement is that the Department develop a differentiated system of recognition, accountability, and support for schools and districts. The Commissioner explained that the Department is developing new ambitious but achievable annual goals for schools and districts to replace the AYP system mandated by NCLB. He stated that Connecticut's new goals will value growth, will emphasize closing the state's achievement gap, and will be coupled with a system of targeted support for the state's highest need schools and districts. The third requirement of the ESEA waiver application is the development and implementation of a system of evaluation and support for teachers and principals. The Commissioner summarized the work of the Performance Evaluation Advisory Council (PEAC), which includes a diverse

group of stakeholders as established in legislation. He stated that the committee is in the process of developing a system of evaluation that includes multiple measures of student learning and professional practice. The final waiver requirement is that the state must reduce unnecessary burden. The Commissioner explained that the Department is in the process of evaluating and revising its administrative requirements to reduce duplication and unnecessary burden on LEAs and schools.

Commissioner Pryor also noted that he has continued on his "listening tour," which has informed the work on the waiver, the legislative package, and the agency reorganization. Charlene Russell-Tucker is leading a new round of stakeholder engagement on the components of the waiver, including teachers and their representatives, principals, superintendents, parents, civil rights groups, individuals with an interest in English language learners and students with disabilities, etc.
