# CONNECTICUT STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Hartford

Minutes of Meeting April 4, 2012

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, April 4, 2012, at the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

#### I. Call to Order

### II. Public Participation

1. Cheryl Miller, parent of Middletown student, described the impact that bullying had on her son's education while he was a student at Middletown High School and urged the Board to find ways to remedy bullying.

2. Cheryl Martone, an advocate for parents, recommended that background checks on administrators be performed as a way to prevent parents from being bullied in schools and in court. Schools need to support parental involvement, Ms. Martone noted.

## V. Report of the Chair

Mr. Taylor reported the following:

- Josh Friedman and Simon Brewer are winding their way through the General Assembly confirmation approval process.
- The search for next year's student members is underway; the State Student Advisory Council on Education screened approximately 75 applications and will conduct interviews later this month.
- Josh Friedman and Simon Brewer met with Governor Malloy in late March as part of an "on-the-record" conversation with high school newspapers from across the state to discuss education reform and its impact on high school students.
- Josh Friedman wrote an article titled, "Social Inclusion and Mentally Ill Students," to be published by the National Association of State Boards of Education (NASBE) next month.

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- The Skills USA Contest was held on March 30, 2012, at A.I. Prince Technical High School; Patricia Keavney-Maruca attended.
- Several Board members chaired public hearings over the course of the past month, to hear testimony on the applications for charter renewals.
- The NASBE Legislative Conference, meetings with Congressional Delegates, and the NASBE Board of Directors meeting were held last week.
- On March 22, 2012, Terry Jones attended the Yale Education Leadership Conference, "Connecticut at the Tipping Point." Governor Malloy led a panel discussion of state activists, policy makers and educators regarding leveling the field to close the achievement gap.
- Governor Malloy has continued his Education Reform Tour across the state. Mr. Taylor thanked those Board members who have participated in the sessions.
- Discussion ensued regarding the 2012 State Board of Education retreat. Theresa Hopkins-Staten, Charles Jaskiewicz and Estela López volunteered to serve on a planning committee.

# **VI.** Report of the Commissioner

Commissioner Pryor highlighted those elements of Senate Bill 24 that, to date, have been preserved or modified by the ongoing legislative process. A copy of the Commissioner's power point presentation is included in the official file of this meeting. The Commissioner noted that he will continue to work with the General Assembly on a bill that will result in meaningful education reform. Discussion ensued.

Commissioner Pryor informed the Board that he has chosen to follow a set of procedures when the Department or State Board of Education address formal matters (such as charter renewals or revocations) directly affecting schools run by charter school organizations on whose boards he previously served (Achievement First and Common Ground). He will delegate a senior staff member to handle these matters, including their presentation to the State Board.

# A. Approval to Relicense a program in Philosophical-Theological Studies offered at St. John Fisher Seminary Residency, Stamford, St. John's University, Jamaica, NY

# **G.** Approval of Achievement First Residency Program for School Leadership

RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education, pursuant to Section 10-145d-9(g)(2)(A) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, grants program approval for the period April 4, 2012, to April 4, 2014, with a report and on-site visit required for continuing approval beyond two years, for the purpose of certifying graduates from the Achievement First Residency Program for School Leadership (RPSL).

# H. Amendment to the National Association of State Directors of Education and Certification (NASDTEC) Interstate Agreement Concerning Out-of-State Alternate Route to Certification Programs

RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education, amends the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education & Certification (NASDTEC) Interstate Agreement by including state-approved alternative educator preparation programs to allow the issuance of a temporary, ninety-day certificate to qualified candidates, and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

# X. Items Requiring Action

# A. Approval of Regulations Concerning Special Education

Mrs. Luke moved, Mr. Jaskiewicz seconded, that the State Board of Education adopts the amendments to Sections 10-76a-1 to 10-76d-19, inclusive, Sections 10-76h-1, 10-76h-3 to 10-76h-10, inclusive, and Sections 10-76h-13, 10-76h-15 and 10-76h-16 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, concerning the provision of special education and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

Mr. Wright moved, Mr. Jaskiewicz seconded, that the Board amend the resolution by repealing subsection (a) of Section 10-76h-14 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies.

Mr. Wright moved, Mr. Jaskiewicz seconded, to amend the amendment by adopting the burden of proof as it exists, with the exception of instances where the moving party elects to unilaterally take their child out of the district and subsequently makes a complaint and submits a request for reimbursement.

Mr. Wright withdrew his motions to amend; Mr. Jaskiewicz withdrew his second to the motions.

### C. Resolution Regarding Senate Bill 24

Mr. Jaskiewicz moved, Mr. Jones seconded, to add to the agenda Item X.C., Resolution Regarding Senate Bill 24, as follows:

WHEREAS, every student in the State of Connecticut has a constitutional right to a high quality education that prepares him or her to be ready for either the workforce or college; and

WHEREAS, it has been identified that educational outcomes in the State of Connecticut exhibit a significant achievement gap, and that the State's schools are in need of significant reform to address this and other critical educational issues; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that education is a key component to economic development and growth in Connecticut, creating a skilled workforce, attracting new businesses, and retaining talent in our state; and

WHEREAS, education reform must be initiated now so this and future generations have the knowledge and skills to succeed and a desire to stay in and contribute to the growth of Connecticut; and

WHEREAS, the original Senate Bill 24 contained many solutions to begin to address the State's educational challenges, is immediate and progressive, and positions our State to

achieve a high performing and nationally recognized public education system, which is a reputation this state once enjoyed; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 24 has been modified in such a manner that meaningful and immediate education reforms such as Connecticut's Elementary and Secondary Education Act waiver and *Sheff v. O'Neill*-related programs are now at risk of being compromised, having a negative impact on the education, growth, and development of our great State;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education urges lawmakers to restore Senate Bill 24 to its original intent so that our State can achieve the level of educational excellence that was once a source of great pride.

Brian Mahoney, Chief Financial Officer, reported that \$313,181 for minority recruitment is in the 2012-13 budget. He noted that this is the same amount as was allocated in fiscal years 2011-12 and 2010-11. Mrs. Hopkins-Staten requested information on progress toward meeting the goals for this initiative.

#### **Finance, Audit and Department Matters**

Mrs. Luke reported that the minutes of the last meeting have been inserted in the supplemental folder and asked the Board to read them. She noted that the Director of Internal Audit position has been posted.

## **Legislation and Bylaws**

Mrs. Hopkins-Staten noted that the committee received a detailed report on the status of Senate Bill 24. She noted that the Department needs to be aware of many compliance issues that resulted from legislation passed last year. She requested that the Board receive a report on charter schools, including information on attrition, admissions, and reasons for declining admission or leaving a charter school after being enrolled.

### **Policy Development**

Dr. López noted that the committee met on March 7, 2012, and agreed to review current policies, but will wait until the General Assembly's work has concluded in order to align its work accordingly.
