Draft Minutes of Meeting

September 5, 2012

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, September 5, 2012, at the Legislative Office Building, Room 1D, Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT.

I. Call to Order

II. Public Participation

- Barbara Zuras, a member of the Sheff Movement Coalition, spoke to the Board about the importance of preschool as part of the state's efforts to provide quality integrated education options, and urged the Board to focus on what is best for Connecticut's most disadvantaged students. A copy of Ms. Zuras' prepared remarks included in the official file of this meeting.
- 2) Sean P. O'Connell, Interim Vice President of Academic Affairs at Albertus Magnus College, stated that he was accompanied by Saylor Heidmann, Director, Education Programs and Joan Venditto, Coordinator for the AMC AAP Program for Reading and Language Arts Certification, in support of continued approval of educator preparation programs at Albertus Magnus. He summarized the college's efforts and success toward remedying those NCATE standards that the visiting team identified as "not met," and offered additional documentation to show the progress made.

- 3) Merrill Gay, parent representative on the Steering Committee and Treasurer for the Connecticut Coalition for Justice in Education Funding (CCJEF), spoke on behalf of CCJEF in regard to the Petition for Declaratory Ruling pertaining to whether school districts should be held liable for tuition to interdistrict magnet school programs for preschool students enrolled in out-of-district programs. A copy of Mr. Gay's prepared remarks is contained in the official file of this meeting.
- 4) Hyacinth Yennie, Hartford resident, expressed concerns about the impact that testing has on the education of students. She noted that students need a core education in order to be well rounded. She also noted that the preschool program offerings should be expanded.
- 5) Martin Edgar, former substitute teacher at Vinal Technical High School, expressed his concerns about not being invited back to substitute teach at that school, and encouraged the Board to include teachers, parents, students and principals on the new governing board for the Connecticut Technical High School System.

VI. Report of the Chair

Chairman Taylor reported the following:

He attended the NESCC Council Meeting, on August 29, in Portsmouth, NH. The participants discussed Smarter Balanced Assessments, proficiency-based learning, and implications for state work plans.

The American Diploma Project Network (ADP) Leadership Team Meeting will be held September 13-14, 2012, in Alexandria, VA. Mr. Taylor will attend this meeting which will engage participants around the college- and career-ready policy agenda, with a focus on coherence and alignment. The two-day session provides a forum for state sharing, peer networking and access to resource experts on cutting edge issues, as well as the opportunity to develop a shared understanding of action steps to further implement and sustain the college- and career-ready policy agenda.

The National Association of State Boards of Education will hold its annual conference October 10-13 in Chicago, IL. The conference, titled "The Future is Now...What's Next?" will focus on evidence-based policymaking and innovation. Mr. Taylor and Mr. Wright will attend.

The Board discussed at its recent retreat the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee to Review SBE Committee Structure. The board liaison is gathering information from other states for review by the Board. Upon receipt, Mr. Taylor will contact members regarding assistance in reviewing this information and shaping a proposal for our committee structure to be more effective in providing leadership.

VII. Report of the Commissioner

Commissioner Pryor reported on the following:

Status of Alliance Districts: All thirty districts submitted their plans for review by the August 15, 2012, deadline. The Department has provided technical assistance to the early applicants via an iterative process. The Department sought outside counsel from several professionals, including former commissioners of education, superintendents, etc. Districts are making revisions in response to some issues that were identified (e.g., insufficient information, insufficient focus, supplanting funds, design of initiatives), and we are hopeful that these revisions will result in approval of the plans by the end of September or early October. Final plans must be approved by each district's local board of education in order to receive funding. Commissioner Pryor summarized the contents of three district plans that have been reviewed and are being revised in response to feedback: Ansonia, Windsor Locks, and Naugatuck. He noted that districts are matching the funding invested by the state. He stated that uniformly-applied conditions are placed upon districts prior to plan approval (i.e., redesign process for lowest performing schools; implementation of district-wide teacher and administrator evaluation; linkage of professional development process to evaluation; and strategic planning).

Biennial Budget Planning Process: All state agencies have begun the process and have submitted their current services and capital biennial budget proposals to the Office of Policy and Management (OPM) by the August 31, 2012, deadline. Commissioner Pryor noted that he has requested that Patricia Luke, Chair of the Finance, Audit and Department Matters Committee, place this matter on the September 13, 2012, committee meeting agenda for further discussion. In addition to what has already been submitted to OPM, the Committee will also explore potential expansion and reduction options for possible discussion at the October 3, 2012, State Board of Education meeting. The preliminary budget expansions are due to OPM by October 1, 2012, and all biennial budget requests are due by October 26, 2012. Commissioner Pryor stated that he will give periodic updates on the budget process.

VIII. Connecticut Technical High School Matters

Superintendent of Schools Patricia Ciccone reporting the following:

Measures taken over the summer months to increase security in and around Bullard Havens Technical High School include security cameras and video surveillance, new locks and rekeying, metal detectors and wands, continuation of SRO's from the state police. Parents and students are responding positively and gratefully to the increased security measures.

Opening enrollment in the Connecticut Technical High Schools was 10,907 as of yesterday morning. Today we have fluctuated to 10,854. We are watching that as there is an added impact of students whose sending districts will not transfer all year with the new 6,000.00 statutory cap. She noted that the official census count will be annouced at the Board meeting after the October 1 census date.

The CTHSS won a National Network of Partnership Schools, affiliated with Johns Hopkins University, for its parent engagement initiative. The district was honored for developing its leadership on partnerships and guiding schools to develop goal-oriented programs of school, family and community partnerships. Three of the CTHSS schools, Emmett O'Brien in Ansonia, Norwich Tech in Norwich and Oliver Wolcott in Torrington will have their best practices published in this year's National Network of Partnership Schools' Promising Partnership Practices 2012 book.
