Minutes State Board of Education Meeting January 7, 2015 (approved February 4, 2015)

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, January 7, 2015, in Room 307 of the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

I. Call to Order

Attorney Louis B. Todisco, Commissioner of the Superior Court, administered the Oath of Office to Dr. Dianna R. Wentzell (copy in official file).

- II. Public Participation
 - 1. Kate Fioravanti, District Arts Supervisor, New London Public Schools, thanked the Board for its support for arts education, providing grant opportunities, and the leadership of State Department of Education staff (Scott Shuler and Jackie Coleman). Ms. Fioravanti extended an invitation to the Board to visit New London Public Schools to witness their progress in the arts.
 - 2. Diana Coyne, Parents Concussion Coalition, read prepared remarks and asked that the Board follow the model used in Maryland via a task force comprised of a diverse group of experts that reports directly to the State Board of Education. She recommended that the task force allow public comments on its recommendations. A copy Ms. Coyne's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
 - 3. Pippa Bell Ader, Westport, a member of the Parents Concussion Coalition, spoke about the importance of successfully implementing the concussion law and the need for communication with school districts and parents. She encouraged the Board to take a more active role in enforcing the law. A copy Ms. Bell Ader's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.

- 4. Deb Shulansky, Director of Community Outreach and Support, Brain Injury Alliance of Connecticut (BIAC), expressed her appreciation for the work of the Youth Concussion Advisory Group pursuant to Public Act 14-66, and stated there is a need for more review and comment. She urged the Board to establish an ongoing task force of professionals who work with student athletes and individuals who have sustained a concussion, as well as those who educate the public on the prevention of brain injury. A copy Ms. Shulansky's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- Rie Poirier-Campbell, Executive Director of Hartford Performs, spoke about the importance of the arts in education and in the community, and the impact the arts have on students' success. She commended the Department for hiring Ms. Jackie Coleman as the new arts consultant. A copy Ms. Campbell's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- 6. Cheryl Hill, a Connecticut parent and taxpayer, expressed concerns about privacy and the extent of data collection. Ms. Hill also expressed concern about the Common Core and

SBAC. A copy of Ms. Hill's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.

- 7. Jesse P. Turner, Ph.D., Central Connecticut State University, spoke about student assessment and the importance of it being balanced with the health, well-being, and fitness of children. He noted that we must look at the "whole child" and present a balanced and broader assessment framework that views performance over time. A copy of Dr. Turner's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- 8. Bonnie Koba, Arts in Education Program Manager, Connecticut Office of the Arts, thanked the Board for its support of arts and the importance of the arts in developing a well-rounded student. She stated that she was pleased with the opportunity to collaborate with the new arts education consultant, Jackie Coleman, and looks forward to continuing to work with the State Department of Education.
- 9. Robert Cotto, Jr., Connecticut Voices for Children, spoke regarding diversity (racial, ethnic, ELL, special education, socioeconomic) and access in Connecticut school choice programs. A copy of Mr. Cotto's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- 10. Ann Monroe-Baillargeon, Ph.D., Dean of the School of Education, University of St. Joseph, West Hartford, spoke on behalf of the Connecticut Chapter of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education. She noted that AACTE-CT has made a commitment to stay informed and engaged in all matters of education in Connecticut (i.e., stakeholder, EPAC and State Board meetings; Commissioner search). A copy Dr. Baillargeon's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- 11. Dr. Kevin Basmadjian, Dean of the School of Education at Quinnipiac University and a member of AACTE-CT, urged the Board to exercise caution and consider the potential for unintended consequences before approving new policies and regulations that would transform teacher preparation. He recommended that someone from Connecticut's teacher preparation programs serve on the Commissioner Search Committee. A copy Dr. Basmadjian's prepared statement is included in the official file of this meeting.
- 12. Kristin Steeves, history education major at Central Connecticut State University, expressed her support for the Social Studies Framework and urged the Board to adopt the Framework at its February 2015 meeting.
