Minutes State Board of Education Meeting May 6, 2015

(approved June 3, 2015)

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, May 6, 2015, in Room 307 of the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

I. Call to Order

Oath of Office

Attorney Louis B. Todisco, Commissioner of the Superior Court, administered the Oath of Office to reappointed Board member Stephen P. Wright (a copy is in the official file).

II. Public Participation

- David Schlakman, President of the Board, New Beginnings Family Academy (NBFA),
 Bridgeport, spoke in support of the State Board of Education granting a five-year charter
 renewal to NBFA, to allow the school to continue to increase its students' success. A copy of
 Mr. Schlakman's prepared remarks is enclosed in the official file of this meeting.
- 2. Juan Rivas, a parent of a child who attends New Beginnings Family Academy (NBFA), Bridgeport, spoke in support of the State Board of Education granting a five-year charter renewal to NBFA.
- 3. Christine King, parent of two students who attend New Beginnings Family Academy (NBFA), Bridgeport, spoke about the benefits of the school's sibling policy, the positive impact the

school has had on her children's grades and self-confidence, and the high level of communication between parents and faculty. She urged the Board to support the resolution to renew the charter for five years.

- 4. David Howes, Principal of the Interdistrict School for Arts and Communication (ISAAC), New London, stated that ISAAC represents a great choice for New London area students and that he believes in its mission. He expressed his support for the Board's approval of the proposal to renew ISAAC's charter for five years.
- 5. Lisa Lessard, resident of Waterbury, a parent of a student with special education needs and a special education advocate, expressed her concerns regarding the oversight of and accountability for special education in Waterbury. She expressed concerns about the use of Alliance District funds in Waterbury, and questioned the status of Walsh Elementary School.
- 6. Jill Johnson, Executive Director and Principal of Explorations Charter School, spoke about the school's continued use of data and how it informs curriculum and professional development, and described future efforts to continue to address the students' unique needs. A copy of Ms. Johnson's prepared remarks is enclosed in the official file of this meeting.
- 7. Craig Baker, Chief Education Officer, Stamford Academy, stated that when looking at data regarding Stamford Academy, it is important to consider the school's unique mission, the student population it serves, and its role in the community. A copy of Mr. Baker's prepared remarks is enclosed in the official file of this meeting.
- 8. Chris Bugbee, Principal, Odyssey Community School, Manchester, described the school's significant growth over the past five years, the grade expansion, and the positive relationship Odyssey has with surrounding communities.
- 9. Tom Stringfellow, resident of Manchester, congratulated Dr. Wentzell on her appointment, and recommended several articles and publications concerning the role and contributions of African Americans in U.S. history.
