# State Board of Education Meeting June 3, 2015 (approved July 1, 2015)

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, June 3, 2015, in Room 307 of the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

#### I. Call to Order

#### Oath of Office

Attorney Matthew E. Venhorst, Commissioner of the Superior Court, administered the Oath of Office to reappointed Board member Joseph J. Vrabely, Jr. (a copy is in the official file).

#### II. Public Participation

- 1. Tom Stringfellow, a resident of Manchester, recommended several publications pertaining to history and cited numerous contributions of veterans of war to our country.
- 2. LaShawn Robinson, a resident of Hartford, expressed her concerns about the Hartford Public School System's policy of "last in, first out" and its negative impact on education.
- 3. Milly Arciniegas, Director of the Hartford Parent University, reinforced Ms. Robinson's concerns and stated that a "last in, first out" policy will result in inequities in schools. Ms. Arciniegas told the Board that she plans to work with legislators on this matter. She added that she is

pleased to announce that the Hartford Parent University is graduating 34 parent leaders on June 19, 2015.

4. Three members of the State Student Advisory Council on Education summarized the Council's work over the course of the past year and their suggestions on the three topics studied. Emily Williams, Farmington High School, presented an overview of the Council's research of and recommendations related to the appropriate start time for elementary and high school students. Taylor Schwab, Suffield High School, presented an overview of and recommendations related to the Council's research on the value of community service learning. Peter Russell, Greenwich High School, presented an overview of and recommendations related to the Council's research on student assessment in Grade 11. Discussion followed. A. Application for Funds: SLDS Grant

Ajit Gopalakrishnan, Interim Chief Performance Officer, introduced the panel consisting of partner agencies of the Data Governing Board for P20 WIN (Connecticut's Preschool through Twenty and Workforce Information Network): Jan Kiehne, Policy Research, & Strategic Planning, Connecticut Board of Regents for Higher Education; Jennifer Widness, Vice President, Connecticut Conference of Independent Colleges; William J. Gammell, Interim Director of Policy and Research, Connecticut Board of Regents for Higher Education; and Andrew Condon, Director, Research and Information, Connecticut Department of Labor.

Mr. Gopalakrishnan summarized the priority areas of Connecticut's two data systems, IES (Institute of Education Sciences) SLDS (Statewide Longitudinal Data Systems): (1) Instructional Support – Early Warning Systems (EWS), and (2) College and Career. Discussion followed.

VI.F. Approval of High School Work Group's Interim Recommendations as Framework for Subsequent Final Proposal regarding High School Mastery Examination

Mrs. Hopkins-Staten moved, Mrs. Benham seconded, that the Board approve the following resolution.

Whereas, On September 5, 2014, Governor Dannel P. Malloy directed the State

Department of Education to convene a work group to examine ways to reduce

test burden on Grade 11 students;

Whereas, The State Board of Education established a high school assessment work group

as an extension of its Academic Standards and Assessment Committee, comprised of representatives from the Connecticut Association of Boards of Education, the Connecticut Association of Schools, the Connecticut Association of Public School Superintendents, the Connecticut Parent Teacher Association, the American Federation of Teachers-Connecticut, the Connecticut Education

Association, the Board of Regents, a designee of the Connecticut General Assembly Education Committee, and other technical experts in the area of student assessments:

Whereas,

The work group has been meeting regularly since November 2014 to study various college readiness exams and has heard directly from experts, students, and teachers: and

Whereas,

After careful and thoughtful consideration, the group reached consensus on May 26, 2015, to move towards a nationally recognized college readiness exam for purposes of satisfying the high school mastery assessment requirement under Connecticut and federal law, provided that the following conditions are met:

- 1) The assessment offers appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities and students who are English learners;
- 2) The Connecticut General Assembly appropriates sufficient funding to cover the costs of:
  - a. Procuring and administering a nationally recognized college readiness assessment to all students in Grade 11;
  - b. Building systems for data integration, reporting, and accountability and increased staffing needs of the CSDE necessitated by the transition to a new statewide high school assessment; and
  - c. Supporting equity in access to test preparation resources;
- 3) The assessment complies with all federal laws and regulations and receives approval from the U.S. Department of Education as an amendment to the state's Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) flexibility renewal request; and
- 4) The work group continues to convene and consult stakeholders and experts in order to address the aforementioned conditions in the development of the final recommendation regarding the Grade 11 statewide mastery examination, which will be presented to the State Board of Education for its consideration; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The State Board of Education approves the work group's interim recommendations as the framework for the final recommendation regarding the state's high school mastery exam, which will be presented to the State Board of Education for consideration for approval pursuant to C.S.G. 10-14n (a) and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.
