III. Integrated Learning Supports Research

Committee Chair Hopkins-Staten thanked the representatives from Scholastic for attending the committee meeting. Chair Hopkins-Staten introduced Dr. Shirley H. Smith, Ph.D., Executive Consultant, Scholastic Education, who thanked the Committee for taking the time to consider the important topic of integrated learning supports and gave a brief overview of work in this area nationally.

Dr. Smith introduced her staff members, Ms. Morgan Ford and Ms. Julie Dyson. Ms. Ford gave the Committee some background on Scholastic, stating that they were founded in 1920, and their mission is to promote teachers and students. Recently, they moved into professional development. Their goal is to get communities involved and have systems in place to help failing students.

Ms. Ford presented a PowerPoint presentation on Learning Supports, which include resources, strategies and practices that support intellectual, physical, social and emotional development to ensure student success. She highlighted successes in the Gainsville, Georgia, school district and in pilot programs in schools in Alabama, attributable to the implementation of integrated learning supports.
