Minutes State Board of Education Meeting January 4, 2017

(approved February 1, 2017)

Pursuant to notice filed with the Secretary of the State, the State Board of Education (hereinafter "Board") met on Wednesday, January 4, 2017, in Room 307 of the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut.

I. Call to Order

Chairperson Allan Taylor called the meeting to order at 9:41 a.m.

II. Public Participation

- 1. Sally Connolly, parent of four children, all of whom have or currently are attending McKinley School in Fairfield, spoke in support of the Board approving the Fairfield Board of Education's proposed amendment to its Plan to Correct Racial Imbalance. Ms. Connolly stated that her children did very well academically at McKinley School, and benefitted from its diversity.
- 2. Suzanne Graceffa, a Fairfield parent of three children with varying educational needs, stated that McKinley School has met her children's diverse needs by providing quality services and programs, and her children have made great growth. She noted that the motto "We are family" is upheld at McKinley, and urged the Board to accept the Fairfield Board of Education's proposed amendment to its Plan to Correct Racial Imbalance.

- 3. Tom Stringfellow, resident of Manchester, spoke about several issues related to diversity, including the importance of the Martin Luther King holiday and the contributions made by other civil rights leaders; a local initiative in Manchester to promote students getting along with one another; an article in National Geographic about transgender youth; domestic abuse; and coverage by NPR and Sesame Street.
- 4. Robert Goodrich, a co-founder of Radical Advocates for Cross Cultural Education (RACCE), urged the Board to reconsider its legislative proposal concerning in-school suspensions and chronic absenteeism. He noted that RACCE believes that all forms of exclusionary discipline should be eliminated, as they have unintended consequences that outweigh any perceived benefits. A copy of Mr. Goodrich's prepared statement is enclosed in the official file of this meeting.
- 5. Lawrence Cafero, resident of Norwalk and a member of the Board of Directors for the Side by Side Charter School, spoke in support of the resolution to approve the renewal of Side by Side's charter for a five-year period. He stated that this charter school is a "jewel" within the Norwalk community.

WHEREAS, The Fairfield Board of Education was directed in May 2015 to amend its plan and received an extension of time in July 2015 to engage the community in a discussion regarding a more effective solution for the racial imbalance at McKinley; and

WHEREAS, The Fairfield Board of Education provided an update concerning its progress in regard to amending its plan at the State Board of Education meeting on May 4, 2016 and submitted the current proposed amendment to its plan on or about November 22, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-226c of the C.G.S. requires any board of education with a racially imbalanced school to "forthwith prepare a plan to correct such imbalance" for submission to the State Board of Education and Section 10-226e-5(c)(4) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies requires that any plan to correct racial imbalance must include, among other items, "The proposed methods for eliminating racial imbalance and for preventing its recurrence in the school district;" and

WHEREAS, the current proposed amendment submitted by the Fairfield Board of Education includes steps that may have some positive impact toward correcting racial imbalance at McKinley in the short term but do not appear likely to have a sufficient impact for fully correcting the racial imbalance and preventing its recurrence in the long term.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education, pursuant to Section 10-226d of the C.G.S. and Section 10-226e-6 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, conditionally approves the Fairfield Board of Education's proposed amendment to its plan to correct racial imbalance at McKinley, as follows:

The proposed amendment is approved on the condition that, within 120 days of this resolution, the Fairfield Board of Education shall submit to the State Board of Education a revised amendment to its plan, which shall include additional measures for correcting racial imbalance at McKinley and preventing its recurrence.
