C. Office of the Child Advocate (Sarah Eagan)

Attorney Sarah Eagan, the Child Advocate, presented to the Board on her investigation concerning the death of Matthew Tirado, a teenager with profound disability, in December 2017 and various policy recommendations arising out of the investigation, which are summarized in her May 2, 2018 memorandum which is included in the official file for this meeting.

A. The Red, White and Blue Schools Programs

A panel consisting of Director of Reading and Literacy Melissa Hickey, Greg Frank, K-12 Social Studies Curriculum Specialist, South Windsor Public Schools, Laura Krenicki, Social Studies Teacher, Colchester Public Schools, and Education Consultant Stephen Armstrong, presented on the Red, White and Blue Schools Program, which promotes civic understanding and civic practices. The major aim of the Red, White and Blue Schools program is to emphasize the importance of active citizenship and informed action. The program strongly encourages students to be actively engaged in civic life throughout every stage of their K-12 education. The theme for the 2017-18 school year is "Student Engagement at the Local Level."

B. Update on Implementation of Goal 4, State Board of Education Comprehensive Plan

Chief Turnaround Officer Desi Nesmith provided an update on Goal 4 of the Connecticut State Board of Education's Five-year Comprehensive Plan, *Ensuring Equity and Excellence for All Connecticut Students*. Goal 4 includes providing intensive interventions and supports in Connecticut's most struggling communities, providing assistance in the utilization of the Next Generation Accountability System to measure school progress and inform improvement practices and to hold the district and school accountable for student learning. The strategy focused on building internal capacity of the CSDE cross-divisional review and support teams to effectively support and monitor Opportunity Districts. The strategy also focusses on building external capacity of districts and schools to understand and use evidenced-based interventions and the Next Generation Accountability System.

Goals progress milestones that have been achieved are:

- Development of, training for, and implementation of protocols for CSDE cross-divisional team support of Opportunity Districts and school leadership.
- Development of CSDE Personnel Directory.
- Evidence-Based Guide.
- School-Level Webinars.
- Online Professional Learning Calendar.
