A. Continuing Approval of Charter Oak State College Educator Preparation Program

Resolved, That the State Board of Education, pursuant to Section 10-145d-9(g)(1)(A) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies grants full approval to Charter Oak State College (COSC), Early Childhood Education, Alternate Route to Certification (ECE ARC) Program, for the period December 1, 2023, through November 30, 2030, with annual progress monitoring conducted using program key assessment performance data, for the purpose of certifying graduates from COSC ECE ARC, and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

B. Approval of 2023-2024 Annual Audit Plan

Resolved, That the State Board of Education adopts the Annual Audit Plan for the period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

C. Approval of Proposed Contract for Whole School Management Services Between Booker T. Washington Academy, Inc. and Elevate Charter Schools, Inc.

Resolved, That the State Board of Education, pursuant to Section 10-66tt of the Connecticut General Statutes, approves the contract for whole school management services between Booker T. Washington Academy, Inc. and Elevate Charter Schools, Inc. and directs the Commissioner to take the necessary action.

VI. Report of the Commissioner with Agency Update

The Commissioner highlighted the following:

- CSDE is undergoing transition as CFO Kathy Demsey moves on to OPM.
- o Department's Affirmative Action Plan has been approved.
- o She attended CABE & CSDE meeting and provided feedback on the SBE plan.
- Attended Ending Achievement Gap meeting with Lt. Governor Bysiewicz and highlighted EdSight.
- DEI symposium with SERC brought together superintendents with their DEI leaders to provide strategies to collaborate.
- o The Hunt Institute Webinar where she spoke of the work we are doing in CT.

- o Community for Education Funding invited her to talk about resources.
- o Attended Dual Credit Expansion Grant Press Event with Governor Lamont.

Dual Credit Program

Chief Performance Officer Ajit Gopalakrishnan and district leader teams from Ansonia - Superintendent Joseph DiBacco and Assistant Superintendent Steve Bergin; Clinton – Superintendent Maryann O'Donnell; and Coventry – Superintendent David Petrone and Director of Teaching and Learning Michelle Mullaly, presented on the program. The Commissioner thanked everyone and elaborated that CSDE is awarding \$3.8M of ARP/ESSER funds to 83 applicants representing 89 school districts across Connecticut to help expand dual credit offerings in high schools. Board members engaged in questions, answers, and comments.

Release of Attendance and Assessment Results

Chief Performance Officer Ajit Gopalakrishnan presented showing that attendance numbers are getting better and that LEAP improves attendance. Achievement shows some improvement but has not yet caught up to pre-pandemic levels. He also mentioned the EdSight Portal's Pandemic Recovery Dashboard. Board members engaged in questions, answers, and comments.

New Kindergarten Entry Age

Chief Academic Officer Irene Parisi gave an update on this legislation and noted the next steps that are being implemented.

Shoutouts

- CT Kids Cabinet announced by the Governor. The CSDE is one of the 10 agencies that will be a part of the cabinet led by the DCF Commissioner.
- CT FASFA Challenge event was attended by the Commissioner and celebrated an increase in participation.
- Voice4Change Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at Derby High School Pavilion was attended by Deputy Commissioner Sone-Moyano. Deputy Commissioner Sone-Moyano shared her experience.
- National Blue Ribbon Schools Four Connecticut schools were named for overall academic excellence.
- Red, White, and Blue Schools program was launched with the Secretary of State to recognize when schools go above and beyond the minimum teaching requirements in civics and government.
- Over 90 leaders attended the Alliance District Symposium.
