CSDE & DCF Considerations

- A call to DCF should be made only if there is a "reasonable suspicion" that child abuse or neglect has occurred.
- Lack of contact does not necessarily indicate child maltreatment. If there is a concern, consider filing a nonemergent report online.
 - FAQ for DCF Electronic Reporting
 - When to Make a Referral to the DCF Careline
- For students who are under the care of DCF/or the family is actively working with DCF, contact assigned worker. DCF staff are teleworking and can be reached by e-mail or state cell phone.



CSDE & DCF Considerations (continued)

- A student's nonparticipation in continued education opportunities does not immediately constitute educational neglect and would not inherently warrant a referral to DCF.
- If there is evidence that the parent/caretaker has access to the necessary resources to participate, is responsible for the child's educational participation (defined as a child under the age of 12 or a child is functionally dependent on a parent/caretaker), and multiple and diverse attempts have been made to engage the parent/caretaker/other resources without success, a referral to DCF may be warranted.
- It is recommended that school staff make every effort to first outreach via phone calls and letters and access other individuals, such as the emergency contact, who knows the family and can assist you to make a connection. A parent/caretaker may need to prioritize a variety of needs to ensure safety, well-being and the overall functioning of the family unit, and if known, this should also be taken into consideration.




CSDE & DCF Considerations (continued)

- Virtual engagement with a student should include a general assessment of their overall well-being.
- If a concern is raised that suggests that a child has been abused or neglected, or a child is presenting with a justified fear of safety in the home, a referral to DCF may be warranted.
- Age appropriate and solution-based safety planning, when appropriate, should also occur in your interactions.




Weekly Trends




Acceptance Rates
