







AccelerateCT Summer Program Expansion Grant Application

- **❖** \$8.6 Million to Expand High-Quality Summer Enrichment Programs for more than 96,000 Connecticut Children
 - Expansion Grants up to \$25,000 to expand access to summer programming
 - Innovation Grants up to \$250,000 to provide innovative summer programming
- **235** grantees were notified Tuesday, May 25

Governor Lamont Proposes Program Allowing
Children to Access Connecticut Museums for Free
this Summer

- Utilizing state funding from the American Rescue Plan
- ❖ All Connecticut children 18 and under plus one accompanying adult can visit any of the state's participating attractions free of charge from July 1 to September 6
- State attractions such as: Mystic Aquarium, Mystic Seaport Museum, Beardsley Zoo, Connecticut Science Center, and the Maritime Aquarium
 - Full list will be at <u>ctvisit.com</u> by July 1



Governor Lamont Announces Connecticut Exceeds Five Year Goal for Increasing the Diversity of the Educator Workforce

- Goal was to increase the number of educators of color by 10% (about 1,000 positions)
- Over the last five years, CT school districts have hired more than 1,900 educators of color
- Continuing to employ strategies and develop new initiatives to diversify the educator workforce



- Released ARP ESSER Guidance
- Held two public forums with SERC
- Solicited written input from stakeholders
- Currently working on CSDE state plan and supporting districts in their planning


Commitment to Equity

Governor Lamont Launches State Initiative To Address Student Absenteeism and Disengagement Resulting From the COVID-19 Pandemic

- Learner Engagement and Attendance Program (LEAP)
- Office of the Governor, CSDE, and RESCs
- Targeting 15 high-need districts
- Three goals:
 - Bridge students back to school communities
 - Support student enrollment in summer programs
 - Facilitate a seamless transition back into school next year





Apex Learning:

- Grades 6-12
- Supplemental resource to support:
 - Local credit recovery programs
 - Credit accumulation
 - Personalized learning
- Enrichment/Gifted and Talented

Defined Learning:

- Grades K-12
- Supplemental resource to local units of study as a culminating project
- Pre-unit to develop background knowledge for a unit of study sequence
- Enrichment
