II. Welcome and Introductions

Ms. Charlene Russell-Tucker, Chief Operating Officer, Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE)

III. Important Emergent Issues in Education

Ms. Russell-Tucker provided an overview on students and families who have been displaced by hurricanes and are now residing in Connecticut. The <u>presentation</u> identified the total number of displaced students who have enrolled in Connecticut schools by district and grade level. Ms. Russell-Tucker also discussed statewide efforts to support new arrivals, challenges and resources for schools and districts.

Mr. Glen Peterson, Division Director, Connecticut State Department of Education, presented on standards for alternative educational opportunities for students who have been expelled. The presentation discussed Connecticut laws concerning students who have been expelled, the number of students receiving expulsions by race and ethnicity, standards for alternative educational opportunities and guidelines for alternative educational settings. The presentation concluded with information on student placement and transition planning.

IV. Understanding Performance and Accountability

Ajit Gopalakrishnan, Chief Performance Officer, Connecticut State Department of Education, presented on <u>Connecticut's Next Generation Accountability System</u>, the <u>Profile and Performance</u> <u>Report</u> and the <u>EdSight</u> data portal. His <u>presentation</u> discussed federal legislation related to accountability and the CSDE's underlying principles of accountability. He engaged the group in a discussion of the 12 weighted indicators in the state's accountability system and demonstrated how the data are organized into the Profile and Performance Reports for districts.

V. Update Regarding Definition and Framework for Family Engagement

Dr. Judy Carson, Program Manager for School-Family-Community Partnerships, Connecticut State Department of Education, provided an update on the framework for family engagement that has been developed in partnership with the Roundtable. The framework was the subject of a symposium on December 13, 2017, where over 100 people provided feedback. A revised document is being prepared and will be submitted to the Commissioners of Education and Early Childhood.
