II. Welcome and Introductions

Ms. Canady welcomed the group and asked members and guests to introduce themselves. She then reviewed the group's engagement norms. Ms. Charlene Russell-Tucker, Chief Operating Officer of the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE), expressed Commissioner Wentzell's regrets that she was unable to attend the meeting.

III. Emergent Critical Issues in Education

Ms. Russell-Tucker provided information on the following issues:

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- Roundtable members' participation in providing feedback on the <u>Position Statement on</u> <u>Reducing Disproportionality in Suspensions and Expulsions (Exclusionary Discipline)</u> <u>2019</u>
- Board of Regents Uniform Advanced Placement Policy
- A series of memos to Superintendents illustrating high-impact family engagement practices aligned with <u>Connecticut's Definition and Framework for Family Engagement</u>

Ms. Deborah Watson, Project Manager for Family and Community Engagement, Office of Early Childhood, presented an overview of a new transition to kindergarten toolkit for families called <u>Hello Kindergarten!</u>

IV. Connecticut Report Cards

Mr. Ajit Gopalakrishnan, Chief Performance Officer of the CSDE, presented on the <u>Connecticut</u> <u>Report Card</u>. The Connecticut Report Card provides trends on metrics, including enrollment, absenteeism, suspension/expulsion, expenditures, achievement, accountability, graduation and college readiness for every district, school and the state. He demonstrated the new Web site and engaged members in using their own devices to explore data for their own schools and communities.

V. Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act Now: Input on Connecticut's State Plan for the Perkins V Program

Dr. Melissa Hickey, Director, and Ms. Suzanne Loud, Education Consultant, CSDE, reviewed the background of the <u>Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act</u> and engaged the group in a discussion of current thinking regarding career and technical education. Members of the group provided input on key policy issues that will guide the CSDE's new state plan for this federal funding. In addition to providing comments at the meeting, participants were informed that the CSDE is requesting comments in an <u>online survey</u> until July 9, 2019. The CSDE is currently soliciting information from Superintendents regarding their <u>intent to apply</u> for funding in the 2019-20 school year.

VI. Participants' Feedback on Roundtable Experience and Commissioner's Recommendations for Moving Forward

Ms. Canady reviewed a timeline of the Roundtable's accomplishments to date. She facilitated feedback from the group on their experience and their recommendations for moving forward. Ms. Russell-Tucker appreciated Commissioner Wentzell's leadership and dedication to the Roundtable and reiterated the Commissioner's belief in the importance of the group to continue as a permanent part of the CSDE's structure for advising the Commissioner's Office on policy matters.
