



Total Number of Students Who Have Been Displaced – Rate of Change






Locations of Origin of New Arrivals

 - St. Maarten (Hurricane Irma)
 - Florida (Hurricane Irma)
 - Texas (Hurricane Harvey)
 - Mexico (Earthquakes and Hurricane Katia)




Enrollment Locations of New Arrivals





Districts Receiving 10+ Students


Number of Students as of 1/5/2018

Reported Challenges

- Space and capacity
- English as a Second Language certification shortage area
- Lack of academic records and placement challenges
- Identifying and accommodating students' special needs
- Lack of medical records and meeting medical needs
- Unaccompanied youth and legal guardianship
- Stress, trauma and mental health
- Material needs, e.g., school supplies and winter
 clothing
