## **Enjoy the Book Together**

- Look for examples of how the writer changes the size of words and uses capital and small letters to tell the story.
- Talk about how Piggy and the Whale are the same even though one is big and the other is little.
- What is the surprise in the story?

#### **Make Personal Connections**

- Talk about how your child feels when he or she is around bigger children.
- Draw a picture of your family members from smallest to biggest.
- Compare the sizes of big and little things in your home.

## **Literacy Tip**

- This is an excellent book for children learning to read. The important story words are repeated throughout the book so children will begin to recognize them independently.
- Each time you read the book, stop when you come to the words big and little, so your child can join in the reading.
