**SUBJECT:** Evidence-Based Practice Guides

The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) has identified leading practices in seven school improvement areas that research suggests will increase the likelihood of improved student outcomes. The leading practices found in the CSDE Evidence–Based Practice Guides are aligned to local, state, and federal long-term education goals.

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), emphasizes the use of evidence-based activities, strategies and interventions (collectively referred to as "interventions"), and defines an evidence-based intervention as being supported by one of the following "tiers" of evidence:

- 1. Strong evidence
- 2. Moderate evidence
- 3. Promising evidence
- 4. Evidence that demonstrates a rationale

The U.S. Department of Education Non-Regulatory Guidance, "Using Evidence to Strengthen Education Investments" outlines the four tiers and provides additional support in the selection of appropriate interventions.
