SUBJECT: Science Evidence-Based Practice Guide

Since 2017, the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) has published Evidence-Based Practice Guides for English Language Proficiency, On-Track Graduation, Reading, Mathematics, Climate and Culture, Early Learning, and Student, Family, Community Engagement. These guides are intended to inform school and district decision-making regarding instructional and student support programming, and to optimize the use of local, state, and federal school improvement funds.

The CSDE has continued its efforts in expanding the Evidence-Based Practice Guide collection to include other topics. This year, the CSDE is pleased to offer you the Science Evidence-Based Practice Guide.

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), emphasizes the use of evidence-based activities, strategies and interventions (collectively referred to as "interventions"), and defines an evidence-based intervention as being supported by one of the following "tiers" of evidence:

- 1. Strong evidence
- 2. Moderate evidence
- 3. Promising evidence
- 4. Evidence that demonstrates a rationale

The CSDE will continue its commitment to expanding the collection to include other topics, and updating our guides as our stakeholders require and as the field of research grows.
