The CTNG offers a wide array of occupational specialties through which its members serve their local community, state, and nation. The CTNG is always ready, and always there, to support our state when called upon. In turn, we ask that you support their recruiting efforts within your respective school districts.

As such, the Department encourages districts to collaborate and develop an important strategic partnership with the CTNG. By permitting CTNG recruiters access to students within appropriate schedules during and after school hours, your students will receive quality information regarding job training, educational opportunities, and benefits of service in the CTNG – an example of the *Universe of Opportunities* before them. In addition to recruitment benefits, CTNG offers districts and students a pathway to citizenship, a pathway to West Point, fitness challenge testing, antibullying campaigns, a STEM trailer, teacher recruitment, staff teambuilding, buildings for events, Star Base for 5th graders, and much more!

While its members may be called upon to serve throughout the world, they primarily live and serve within the state, thereby contributing to the retention of diverse, skilled and marketable employees within Connecticut.
